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**RAMA DEVI WOMEN'S UNIVERSITY**  
**YEAR IN REVIEW**



Rama Devi Women's University, one of the premier institutes for women in the state of Odisha was established in 2015. It is the only Women's university in the state and eastern India, having unitary status with 48 affiliated colleges across nine coastal of the state. The institute was established to commemorate the spirit of the nationalist icon of the State of Odisha Maa Rama Devi and a role model for young women to emulate. Since establishment it has maintained the quality education, influential research and visionary mission, in service of state and society. The University was recognized by UGC under section 22 of the UGC Act 1956. It has been granted provisional membership of Association of Indian Universities (AIU) with effect from 11.5.2016.

Rama Devi Choudhury, fondly addressed as 'Maa Rama Devi', was born on December 3, 1899 at Cuttack (Odisha). What sets Rama Devi Choudhury on a higher pedestal in the list of exemplary freedom fighters and social reformers of India is her sense of ardent compassion for the poor, destitute, untouchable and the landless. One who had the support of no one had 'Maa Rama Devi'. She was the symbol of 'Universal Motherhood' for the Odias. It is significant that the birthday of Maa Rama Devi is marked as the Foundation Day of the University. The seventh Foundation Day of the University will be celebrated on Dec 3, 2021 that marks Maa Rama Devi's 122nd birthday. On the occasion, it is inevitable to reminisce about the sacrifices, struggles and passionate fervor of Maa Rama Devi towards the freedom movement of our nation. It is interesting to note that she was not only adoring woman but was also an affectionate and motherly figure for the underprivileged. She was as skilled on the domestic front as committed to the state of Odisha and the nation.

Maa Rama Devi is popularly acknowledged for her participation in the *Bhoodan* and *Gramdan* movement. She was a messiah for the landless and the poor. She is known for her sacrifice,

dedication and affectionate attitude towards the destitute. She was highly influenced by the principles of Utkalmani Gopabandhu Das and Mahatma Gandhi and is known for her contribution to the Non-Cooperation movement and Quit India movement. She participated in Gandhi's Salt Satyagraha movement that took place in 1930 in Odisha. As the Odisha representative of the Kasturba Trust, she launched many welfare schemes for women in Odisha.

She established the Utkal Khadi Ashram and a Teachers' Training Institute at Ramchandrapur. Her Gram Sevak Press was a bold voice of the media to keep the democracy under check. Her efforts at fighting communalism in Odisha were bold and an example of unprecedented leadership abilities of a woman in the state. Her dedicated service towards the Indian soldiers in the 1962 Indo-China war was also commendable. She breathed her last on July 22, 1985 in Cuttack.

Named after Maa Rama Devi, Rama Devi Women's college was a brain child of the former Chief Minister of Odisha Biju Patnaik. The college began in the labor department of the state government with only 42 students. It was shifted to its existing campus in 1969 that was inaugurated by the then education minister Banamali . It was granted the autonomous status in 1999 for its exemplary contribution to women's education in the state. Rama Devi Autonomous College was upgraded to Rama Devi Women's University on 30 th May 2015. In 2004 and 2015, Rama Devi Women's College and eventually Rama Devi Women's University was conferred as Grade A by NAAC. In 2010, it was conferred with the prestigious title of 'College with Potential for Excellence'. In 2021, Rama Devi Women's University was conferred the UGC 12B status.

Rama Devi Women's University is the first and only women's university in Odisha. It is the best destination of education in Eastern Odisha not only for girl students from remote corners of Odisha, but also from Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and West Bengal. While reminiscing about the seven years that have flown by, on this Foundation Day, we are indeed proud to realize that Rama Devi Women's university has produced not just efficient professionals, but socially conscious, sensitive and empowered women who are at the forefront of the society in regard to their rights, duties and responsibilities. In its short span of its existence since 2015, Rama Devi Women's University has many feathers in its cap. The seven-year journey has been productive in many aspects. Our students have become teachers, management trainees, Content writers, E-commerce employees, business process associates and are well placed in many professions.

## CAMPUS AND FACILITIES

Ramadevi Women's College, Bhubaneswar has the facility of the library, hostel, common room, auditorium, canteen. The other facility includes ATM, Gym centre, language lab and medical facilities. The details about the facilities are given below:

**Library:** The library has a vast collection of volumes which support the teaching and research. The library has the latest volumes, in fields of art, science, technology, and general areas. It has the membership for E-Resources and has a subscription to National and International peer-reviewed e-Journals.

**Hostel:** The university has three hostel - Anandita, Ananya, Anupama. The hostel facilities are provided at three places for convenience to the students. The hostel rooms are equipped with all the modern facilities.

**Common room:** Common room is available for the girls to relax and spend time during the break and off periods.

**Canteen:** The canteen is spacious and offers a variety of food and snacks at reasonable rates.

**Language lab:** The lab provides the benefit to the students to learn the English language skills in reading, writing and speaking with the help of various technologies.

**Auditorium:** The auditorium is equipped with modern facilities. Large functions, workshops, training programmes and cultural programmes are conducted in the auditorium. It has a capacity of 600 people.

**Internet facilities:** Internet facility is available at the library, research centre and administrative block.

**Medical facilities:** The college is located in the centre of the city. Health facility is available near to the college. In the case of any emergency, the college has the facility of the ambulance to take the sick person to the hospital.

**Sports facilities:** Sports facility of the college includes indoor and outdoor games. Students actively take part in sports activities. The coach is available for the training into various games.

**ATM:** SBI ATM, the facility is available at the campus.

**Concession in bus fare:** The University has offered bus concession to the students. Concession reduces the financial expenditure occur to students.

**Gym Centre:** The center promotes a healthy lifestyle and the importance of gym in keeping minds and body healthy. The center also spread awareness towards the physical activities and its importance in academic excellence and practice.

**Seminar and Conference Hall:** The halls are well equipped with e-facilities such as smart boards, computers and projectors. It also has the facility of audio-visual which enhances the effectiveness of presentations.

**Central Computing Facility:** This is a centralized computer center for the staff and students of this college. CCF is maintaining and managing the Campus networking and Internet Facility. It provides both wired and Wi-Fi connectivity to students and staff. Service of Wi-Fi internet connectivity is extended to both the hostels.

**Library:** Rama Devi Women's College Library was started in 1964. In 2004 the library became the first College Library to be automated with a LAN connection to different segments of the library. The Library is now locally Wi-Fi enabled with the internet being available in all computers in the Library. The books and students' cards have been barcoded to facilitate easy and faster circulation. Narrator software jaws were installed into computers for visually impaired students. The College was declared as Rama Devi Women's University on 31st May 2015 and accordingly the library become the Rama Devi Women's University Library. As per the rules laid down in the statutes of the University the Library committee was constituted to deal with the general administration of the library and frame the



relevant rules subject to the approval of the authorities of the University. However, the day-to-day administration and management of the library is to be looked after by the Librarian-cum-Chief Nodal Officer under the overall supervision of the Chairperson P.G. Council.

The University offers a Canteen inside the campus which is managed by an agency chosen by the University. It is the place for spending leisure hours and places for student casual and informal discussions. The Canteen serves mouth-watering snacks, tea coffee, tiffin and sometimes meals too. Students find it easy to order snacks from the Canteen for their weekly seminar snacks. Even the teachers hold their farewell parties with the help of the Canteen food. During University Election it is the main hub of student activities.

The University has a well-maintained lush green campus that spreads over 23 acres of land ensuring adequate availability and optimal utilization of physical infrastructure for teaching-learning activities.

**Classrooms:** The university has well-ventilated and spacious classrooms. There are fifteen (15) overhead projectors with screens and ten (10) fixed projectors in Smart classrooms. There are four academic blocks which house seventy-six (76) classrooms, fifty faculty chambers, ten smart classrooms, twenty-two (22) department laboratories, and ten (10) advanced laboratories. For optimal use of classrooms for UG students, a staggered timetable has been put in place.

The University has four academic blocks. An attempt is made to make optimal utilization of the available facility. There is a multi-purpose hall used for Valuation, Admission, Exhibition, etc.), a Central Library, a Skill Development Center, two auditoriums, an open-air stage, a canteen, a convenience store, a reprographic center, and a boutique. Other utilities like pure RO drinking water and power generators are installed at various locations of the university. The campus has CCTV cameras installed for 24/7 surveillance.

**Labs:** The Department of Life Science, Physics, Biotechnology, and Chemistry has three, four, four, and two labs respectively. The Department of Computer Science, Psychology, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Maths, JMC, English, and Home Science has one lab each.

**ICT facilities:** The institution has ICT facilities such as WiFi, LCD projectors, smart boards, LAN, and audio/video recording options. Laboratories have licensed software and open-source tools to cater to the requirements of curriculum & industry-enabled teaching. The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled with 24/7 internet facility. The ten ICT Classrooms have the provision for Multimedia learning.

**LMS:** The library is a three-storied building including the reading room, board room, newspaper corner, e-library, research scholar's room, and carrels. There is a room for visually impaired students with adequate facilities. The students and staff can access NPTEL Online Course, SWAYAM, E-Pathsala, National Digital Library ([www.ndl.iitkgp.ac.in](http://www.ndl.iitkgp.ac.in)), e-books and e-journals (EBSCO and Science Direct Elsevier) through multimedia computers. Unlimited download of books and articles is possible.

All cultural events take place in the Old Auditorium, Open-Air Stage, and New Theatre Auditorium.

**SPORTS:** RDWU has provision for multiple sports and games and makes optimal use of the available space. Two Badminton courts of 13.40 m length and 6.10 m width are available. The Volleyball court with a play area of 18 m in length and 11 m in width. 30 to 35 students utilize the facility every day. The basketball court of 29 m length and 15 m width is available. Around 25 students practice every day. The students are encouraged to play kabaddi. The total area available is 11m length and 8 m in width. Around 40 students practice every day. The play area of Kho Kho is 27m in length and 16m in width. 25 students practice every day. Chess, Carom and Ludo: Around 40 students practice every day. Table tennis facility is also available. Facility for Yoga and Meditation, and Self-defense practice is also available. Gymnasium facility with adequate equipment is available. The facility can be used by ten users at a time.

## RESEARCH & INNOVATIONS

Rama Devi Women's University takes great pride in maintaining the highest levels of research in the nation with distinguished academics that can compete with the best everywhere. RDWU focus on research that aims to produce and disseminate information and technical expertise through high-quality research for the benefit of people and society. While the number of significant inputs that go into research at the university cannot be measured, some of the deliverables include funds received from extramural sources, research grants, research-based course curriculums, research supervision by faculty members, and the number of students enrolled in postgraduate and doctoral programmes. The research output can be quantified based on quality publications, patents, research consultancies, MoU's, innovation and entrepreneurship

In 2023, research activities have gained special attention at Rama Devi Women's University (RDWU). All Faculties and Centres in RDWU have made significant efforts in order to boost the research output of the University and promote the research culture, which in turn, will contribute to the excellence of the society. The research and innovation have been an integral part of the University's activities and is committed towards building an inclusive, as well as diverse and collaborative research environment, prioritizing quality research and innovation having societal relevance.

- Partnership with state and national Commissions, international agencies, universities must be established.

- Medical Humanities – It is an interdisciplinary field of medicine which includes the humanities (philosophy, ethics, history, comparative literature and religion), Social Science (Psychology, Sociology, Anthropology, Cultural Studies, Health geography), and arts (Theatre, Film, and Visual Arts) and their application to Medical Education and Practice.
- Digital Humanities – Is an academic Discipline that explores the intersection between technologies and culture. It is an interdisciplinary field for people with the background in humanities and the art.
- Disability Studies – Is a branch of study that, examines nature, extent, and consequences of disability for our society and need for mainstreaming these people.
- Indigenous Research - Literature, culture, traditions, life styles etc.
- Post Humanism – Cloning and Robotics - Beyond Humans- Their narratives.

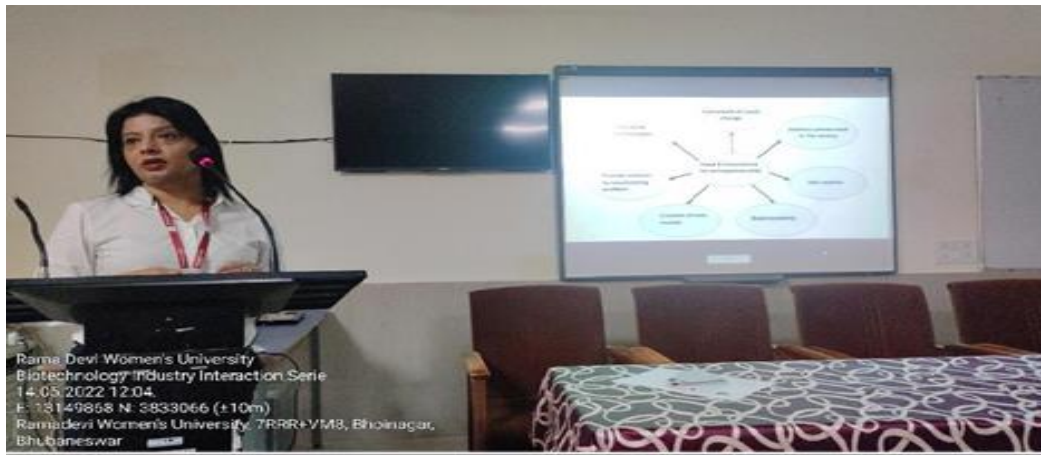

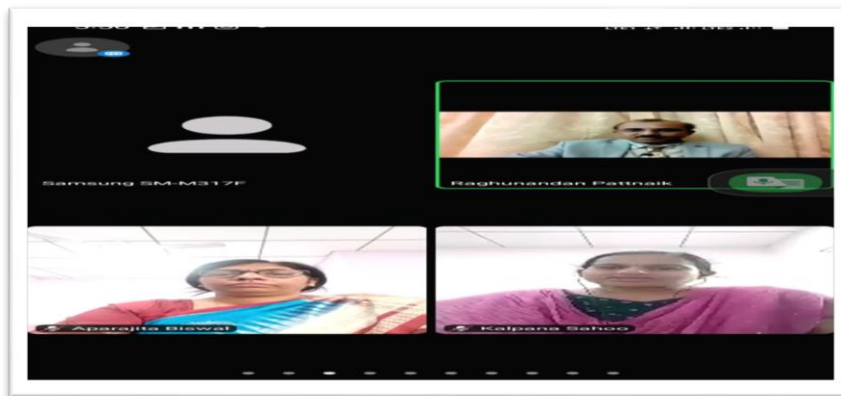

### Topic: One day Panel Discussion on the Odisha State Budget 2022-23: An Analysis

- c) Dr. Aparajita Biswal (HOD, PG Dept. of Economics, RDWU, Bhubaneswar) had joined as a key-note speaker for the Panel Discussion.

**Summary:** The Panel Discussion began with the welcome address by Dr Kalpana Sahoo, Assistant Professor in Economics, RDWU. Prof. Sasmita Mohanty, CPGC & Vice Chancellor (in-charge), RDWU, delivered the inaugural address to the gathering while encouraging the students to take special interest in the Budget.

Dr Biplab Kumar Guru, Assistant Professor in Economics, RDWU, provided a brief overview of Odisha Budget 2022-23. Moreover, he also critically detailed out the Budget trends and patterns over the years. He raised concern over shrinking share of tax revenue vis-a-vis non-tax revenue of the state.

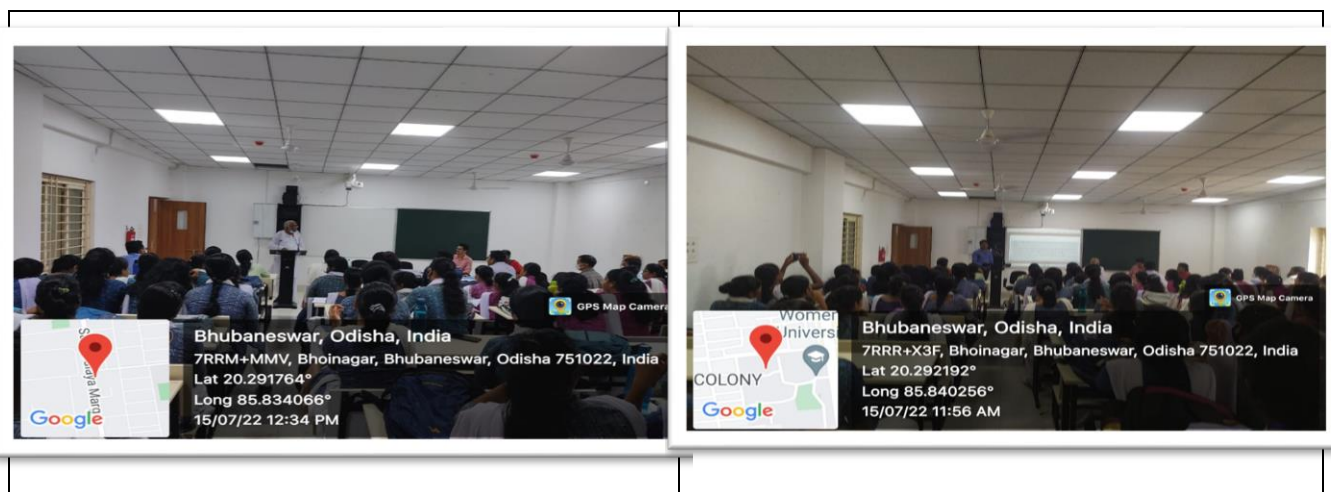
Sri Panahanan Kanungo began his talk by congratulating the Department for holding panel discussion on such an important topic of concern. Sri Kanungo, with more than four decades of experience in policy making and praxis, shared his thoughts on Odisha Budget 2022-23. According to him the Odisha Budget has gone through a sea change in the last couple of decades as has been noticed in a typical Odia village. He likened the Budget to Newton's Law and said a Budget can only yield good result when it works in synergy. He blamed the new tax regime – Good and Service Tax – for dwindling tax buoyancy of the state. He concluded his talk by emphasizing the role of the welfare state, while equating it to a mother, in protecting the vulnerable social groups, gender and needy through the progressive Budget allocation.

Dr. Pravas Mishra began by drawing attention to the ongoing Sri Lankan crisis, and what it suggests about the ill management of the state finance. He pointed out, however critically, some of the best practices in

Odisha Budget making, be it Gender Budget or Climate Budget. Dr Mishra mentioned the various ways though the Budget get disbursed across various Departments and heads. He appealed the students to use Budget as a tool, and not just only as a matter of intellectual exercise, to empower themselves and the society by engaging with the government.

Dr. Aparajita Biswal delivered on “Odisha Budget 2022-23: A Gender Perspective.” She commenced her talk by raising some of the concerns surrounding women in state. She pointed out that women in Odisha lag behind in almost all the indicators of wellbeing viz. health, education, social security, a few to mention. In such a situation, she mentioned, earmarking funds for women is though important but it is also vital to see that these funds really get materialized in the ground. She ascertained that the social accountability of the Budget can help in ensuring justice to the women.

Towards the end of the Panel Discussion, Mr. Pankaj Kumar Naik, Assistant Professor in Economics, RDWU, presented the report of the rapporteur to the gathering. Ms. Sumitra Sethy, Assistant Professor in Economics, RDWU, gave vote of thanks to all the participants. The Panel Discussion was attended by around 120 participants, including students, faculty members from the department and across all other departments and civil society members.

- A one-day Seminar on “Advanced Physics and Applications” By Prof. Pradip Kumar Sahu and Dr. Debakanta Samal. 8<sup>th</sup> May 2023.
- Study tour to IOP Bhubaneswar February 28<sup>th</sup> 2023

1. Department of Physics organized a one day Seminar on "Advanced Physics and Applications" on 8<sup>th</sup> may 2023. On this day two seminars were given by two distinguished professors from IOP Bhubaneswar. One seminar by Dr. Debakanta Samal on the topic condensed matter physics. Another seminar by Prof. Pradip Kumar Sahu on “Fundamentals of Nuclear and Particle Physics: High Density nuclear matter and applications”. Prof. Pradip Kumar Sahu, Registrar, IOP Bhubaneswar was the Chief Guest. The first seminar by Dr. Debakanta Samal focussed on giving the full understanding about what is condensed matter Physics and their respective applications in everyday life. The speaker also addressed the topics of noble laureates such as topology and Spintronics. The seminar of Prof. Pradip Kumar Sahu focused on the subject of fundamental particles of universe and energy production by high density nuclear materials. In this seminar the professor visualized the mechanism of nuclear fusion and nuclear fission which are the fundamental processes employed in nuclear power plants and energy in sun. Prof. Pradip Kumar Sahu highlighted the experiments of CERN (Large Hadron Collider) going in Switzerland where the higgs boson was discovered. After the seminar, the students were interacted with both the speakers and cleared the doubts during the questioner session. The seminar is ended with vote of thanks by the Prof. Raj Kumar Joshi, coordinator, department of physics.



2. A one-day seminar entitled “IANCAS Seminar on Wonder Materials” was conducted on

27/7/22 by the Indian Association of Nuclear Chemists & Allied Scientists -Eastern Regional Chapter (IANCAS-ERC), Bhubaneswar in collaboration with the Institute of Physics, Bhubaneswar, and Physics Department of RD University, Bhubaneswar. The purpose of the seminar is to give awareness on Nanotechnology and Nuclear energy, to the second year graduation Students. Students of Biotechnology, Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Mathematics, Computer science, Physics and Statistics department attended the seminar. After the seminar an experimental session was conducted which was led by Dr. B. Mallick, Secretary, IANCAS-ERC. During the session student were given opportunity to perform experiments on boyles law. Experiments with liquid nitrogen under the vigilance of Dr. B. Mallick were performed by students where the live fish was made frozen and made back to life. Students participated with enthusiasm and learned the experimental science. The seminar is ended with vote of thanks by Dr. Sujatha Mohanty, coordinator, department of physics.

3. A department level seminar was conducted on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2022 by physics department exclusively for physics students of UG course. Two resource persons from different research backgrounds were invited to the seminar. Dr. Sunirmal Saha from C V Raman Global University, Bhubaneswar was invited to give lecture on Atomic models. Prof. Lambodar Prasad Singh, a retired professor from Utkal University, was taken seminar on harmonic oscillator. Dr. Sunirmal Saha's seminar focused on explaining the journey of fundamental atomic physics concepts to advanced atomic models like vector atomic model. Prof. Lambodar Prasad Singh correlated the described the view points of classical theory, quantum theory, and quantum field theory's on simple harmonic oscillator. Students are exchanged ideas and clarified their doubts.
4. RDWU university international cell, in collaboration with Physics and chemistry departments, conducted a seminar by Dr. Dilip Kumar Panda on 19<sup>th</sup> April 2023. Dr. Dilip Kumar Panda took the seminar on "Functional Materials for various energy applications" which is his area of interest. The speaker completed his M.Sc program in NIT Roorkela and completed PhD in abroad and currently in research Assistant Professor in the Department of Materials Science and Engineering, Clemson University, USA. He shared his experiences he gone through while pursuing higher education and growing in career. He shared about the conversations he had with one of The Noble Laureate in chemistry. The seminar mainly focused on materials used in solar cells and other photonic devices. Various synthesis methods and characterization techniques were discussed during the seminar. Students were interacted with the speaker and known about

the pathway of the research career in abroad.

- The students of Physics department RDWU university went for a Research Lab tour to IOP Bhubaneswar on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2023 during the occasion of National science day. During the visit students have seen sophisticated instruments which are only available in IOP Bhubaneswar. The particle accelerators such as LINAC, Cyclotron, Synchrotron and synchro-cyclotron were discussed during the visit. Students also performed live experiments such as Newtonian fluid, total internal reflection and Hologram. Design of Sensor devices, using electrical and electronic components, and their applications to measure blood pressure, heart rate, oxygen level in blood and water level in water tank have been demonstrated. Students were trained to build the digital circuits by themselves for various applications.

## NSS

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government sector public service program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. The NSS bureau at Rama Devi Women’s University, Bhubaneswar was established vide notification no. 3551 dt. 04.08.2017 of the University as per the instruction from the higher education department, Govt. of Odisha vide letter no. X-HE-NSS-53/2016 13.04.2017.

Dr. Bichitra Pani, Reader in Mathematics was appointed as the first programme coordinator of NSS at the University. She was succeeded by Dr. Aliva Mohanty, Associate Professor of Gender Studies as the

NSS coordinator on 16.07.2019 and she continued until 17.10.2022. In pursuance to Govt. order no. 43151 dt. 14.10.2022, Dr. Susant Kumar Patnaik, Reader in Logic & Philosophy of Kamala Nehru Women’s College, Bhubaneswar has been appointed as part time coordinator of NSS Bureau, RDWU.

The NSS bureau of Rama Devi Women’s University, Bhubaneswar has 30 NSS Units and 3000 NSS volunteers as transferred to it from the NSS Bureau of Utkal University vide letter no. X-HE-NSS-53/2016 dt. 13.04.2017 from higher education department, Govt. of Odisha. At present, 28 affiliated colleges have one NSS unit each, while the University has two NSS units.

The center has finally come into existence in the 24th Syndicate of our esteemed institution, on 10th November, 2021. The center has been inaugurated by eminent psychologist Prof. David Carson in presence of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. Aparajita Chowdhury and Prof. Namita Mohanty on 31st October, 2022. With its baby steps, within a very short span of time the center has successfully conducted a one-day consultation on the Draft National Policy for persons with Disability (large no of visually challenged students of our university participated in the discussion) in collaboration with the Odisha Association for the Blind, Child and Women Development Society, conducted a workshop in collaboration with UNICEF & Dept of Gender Studies on the discussion titled Menstrual Hygiene Management Education & Awareness, One Day Campaign on Healthy Dietary Practices for Holistic Health in collaboration with the International Naturopathy Organization, New Delhi. Apart from this,

the center has also organized an extremely engaging workshop on Cyber Security in collaboration with the Red Dot Foundation, the Office of the Us Consulate General US and India. A group counselling session on the Fear of Public speaking and Myths of Communication, autobiography reading sessions, Mindfulness meditation and stress management session has also been organized by the center. 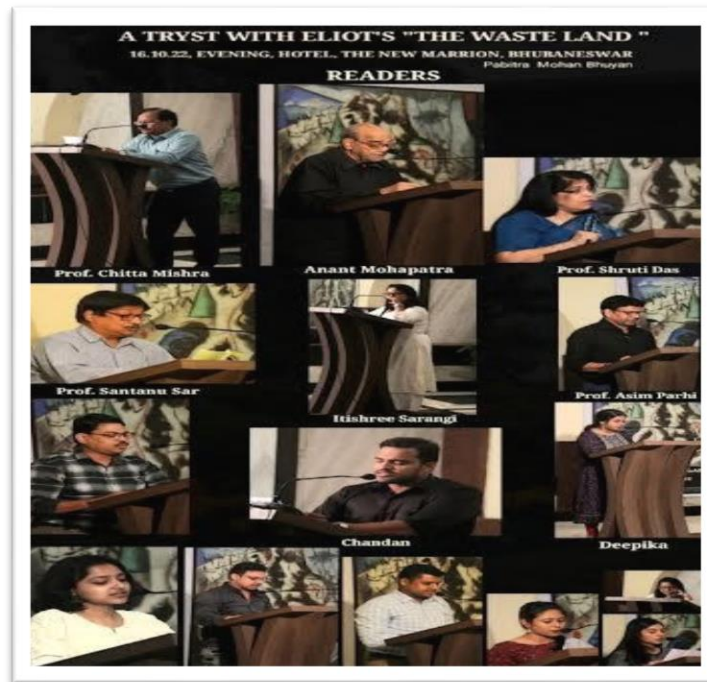

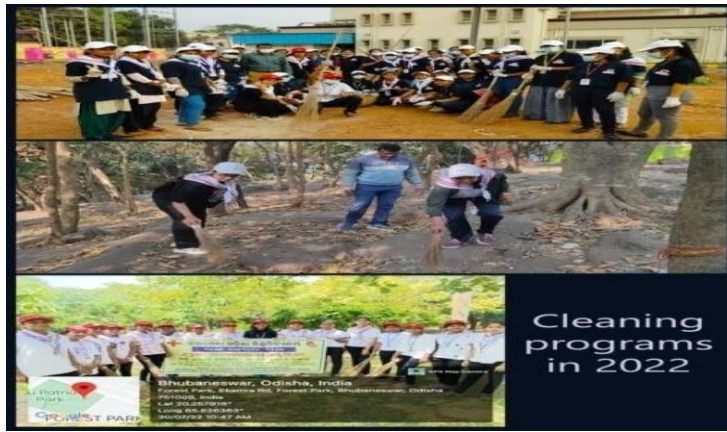

## RIGHT TO INFORMATION CELL (RTI)

The RTI cell of the University functions to coordinate all the work relating to the implementation of RTI Act, 2005. The roles and responsibilities of the RTI cell are as follows:

1. Serve as the nodal point for receiving RTI applications and appeals physically as well as online and forward it to the concerned CPIOs/Appellate Authority within the Department or to other public authority if the matter does not concern this department.
2. Coordinate matters relating to Odisha State Information Commission (OSIC) in terms of hearing, orders and other matters related to the University.
3. Coordinate and prepare proactive disclosure documents of the University and subsequent hosting of the information in the University website.
4. Coordinate all the work relating to the preparation of information sought and released to be submitted to SIC as per RTI Act, 2005.
5. Recommendation for appointment of new CPIOs/Appellate Authorities, compiling the list of CPIOs/Appellate Authorities at regular intervals and circulating the same within the University.
6. Any other work related to the RTI Act, 2005

Any citizen, who desires to obtain information under the RTI Act, 2005 may apply to the Public Information Officer of the University on a requisite RTI application form giving particulars of information being sought for along with his/her address, telephone, no, etc. for communication by the Public Information Officer/Public Authority.
