



EDUCATIONAL INITIATIVES BY UGC

Mulya Pravah 2.0

As part of Quality Mandate initiative, the UGC developed guidelines on 'Mulya Pravah' for inculcation of Human Values and Professionals Ethics in Higher Educational Institutions in 2019. It was revised on the basis of recommendations of NEP 2020 announced on July 29, 2020. quidelines, Mulya Pravah 2.0- Inculcation of Human Values and Professional Ethics in Higher Education Institutions proposes the curriculum and pedagogy of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) to develop deep respect towards Fundamental Duties and Constitutional Values among the students, bonding with one's country and conscious awareness of the roles and responsibilities in a changing world, including universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love (prema), non-violence (ahimsa), scientific temper, citizenship values and also life-skills.



National Higher Education Qualifications Framework

NEP 2020 envisaged the formulation of expected learning outcomes for all higher education programmes. It recommended to formulate a National Higher Education Qualifications Framework (NHEQF) in sync with the National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) to ease the integration of vocational education into higher education. Additionally, it pointed out that "higher education qualifications leading to a degree/diploma/certificate shall be described by the NHEQF in terms of such learning outcomes." The Policy also envisages the setting up of facilitative norms for issues, such as credit transfer, and equivalence, through the NHEQF.



National Credit Framework (NCrF)

National Credit Framework (NCrF) is an inclusive one single meta framework to integrate the credits earned through school education, higher education and vocational & skill education. For creditization and integration of all learning, the National Credit Framework (NCrF) shall encompass the qualification frameworks for higher education, vocational & skill education and school education, namely National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF), National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) and National Curriculum Framework (NCF)/ National School Education Qualification Framework (NSEQF) respectively.
