The University Grant Commission (UGC) guideline for the 11th plan has taken a broader view of Women's Studies constituency by supporting University Women Studies Centre and facilitating them to become teaching and research department in the University system. The past three decades have witnessed the influence of the establishment of these trends within academia, leading to path breaking feminist research in different disciplines, particularly in the social sciences and humanities. In view of the current globalizing gender turn in the International and National New Educational Policy-2020 structure and system, the Women's Studies Centres of the premium Universities in India, have started offering post graduate course in Gender Studies since 2014 and onwards. These are to deal with a broader spectrum of social and cultural aspects connected to male, female, LGBTQ+ from relational, symbolic, feminist and intersectionality perspectives. Gender and sexuality studies analyses relevant topics as they appear in Literature, Language, History, Politics, Sociology, Law, and Medicine. In view of the gender subjectivity a contemporary concern, we reviewed websites of different Universities and Institutions abroad and in India. The premium universities and academic institutions are offering Post Graduation, M.Phil. and Ph.D. programme in Women Studies, Gender Studies and Gender subjectivity from an intersectionality perspective are listed out.

Gender Studies at a Global Scale: The World's premium Universities to name a few which are offering the Gender and Sexuality subject related regular courses at the undergraduate, Graduate or at Doctoral level programme. 
Traversing a journey from Women's Studies to Gender Studies in India

University Grant Commission, New Delhi supported establishment of Women's Studies Centre/School/Department in 1990s have shifted and upgraded their course curricular. Hence, the current trend witnessed an up gradation in the curricular and teaching methods and research, integrated the feminist and gender planning in the development processes. Gender related issues and challenges traversed through discourses and critical and analytical thinking from spatial and intersectional perspectives are crucial to bring parity in the academic stance. Diverse and multidisciplinary intellectuals found pursuing Master Degree/MPhil and PhD on Gender, Sexuality and Intersectional studies worthy. Hence, it is evident that there is a subsequent shift of the Centre for Women's Studies in the in their third phase (especially from 2014 and onwards) and are offering the degree courses in Gender Studies/Gender and Development/Sexuality Studies as a multi-disciplinary field in Master, MPhil. and PhD.

Presently there are 67 Women's Studies Centres established in various Universities and Colleges in the country. The growth of Women's Studies Centres/ Programmes for offering Master in Arts or Master in Sciences on Gender Studies in different Universities and institutions (including TISS), all over the country has demonstrated recognition of the issues that have been highlighted by the women's movement and feminist research over the past many years. Universities and institutions in India are offering the Master in Gender Studies to name a few are National Council for Educational Research and Training established its Dept. of Gender Studies in 2021, JNU, NIRD, Hyderabad, Jamia Millia Islamia University, SNDT, Pune, Mumbai, TISS Mumbai and Hyderabad, University of Delhi Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University of Social Sciences, School of Gender and Development Studies; IGNOU, University of Hyderabad, Rama Devi Women's University, Bhubaneswar. It illustrates how in India the initial feminist movement led by the UGC, New Delhi. The Department of Higher Education Council, Government of Odisha is planning to offer Gender Studies courses at the Under Graduation level. Gender becomes a key concern of at the elementary level education. In view of this, the text books prescribed to the students have been designed. To promote integration of gender subjectivity in research, Indian Council for Social Science Research/ICAR/DST and National Commission for Women in India are encouraging research sponsorships.

JOINT PARTNERSHIP ON GLOBAL CLASSROOM TEACHING PROGRAMME GS-RDWU WITH UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA 2022-23

Introduction

Global Classrooms provides an innovative way for students to gain international experience through virtual technology. They are existing courses, revised by University of California Santa Cruz (UCSC) and their faculty collaborator abroad to incorporate the course design approaches of Virtual Exchange (VE) also known as Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL). These Global Classroom programmer has increased UCSC students' access to global learning by providing them with opportunities to engage and collaborate globally with students at international partner institutions, while also creating opportunities for faculty to strengthen ties with colleagues abroad, through joint teaching and course development, in support of future scholarly collaborations and potential graduate student recruitment.

As part of the inaugural cohort of faculty awardees developing Global Classrooms, faculty have connected with the international partner who teaches in a similar discipline, participate together in professional development training, develop a COIL module/component with concrete goals and deliverables, and implement it in one of your existing courses at UCSC to create a Global Classroom. Global Classrooms are best suited to smaller class sizes with an average enrolment of under 30 and can be undergraduate or graduate courses. The COIL modules/components can vary in scope and duration, but typically last between six and eight weeks within a course and include:

In Winter 2022, "Gender and Development: Cross Cultural Perspectives" course offered by Rama Devi Women's University, in collaboration with the course "Women in Politics: A Third World Perspective (ANTH 194X) by University of California, Santa Cruz as a part of the Division of Global Engagements Classrooms initiative. Prof. Annapurna Pandey, Anthropology Department University of California Santa Cruz, and Prof. Jyortimayee Acharya Dept. of Gender Studies, Rama Devi Women's University have jointly offered the course.

This weekly seminar has been divided into three parts.

1. The first devoted to a theoretical study of women/gender politics, and feminism in relation to the state.

- 2. The second part focused on women constructing their political space and their leadership in different states defined as third world and
- 3. The third part discussed and presented the faculty research projects focused on case studies of women's leadership in relation to the third world.

Student Participants

Students from any discipline can participate in the Global Classroom programme of Rama Devi Women's University. The participants have received the registration ID to participate in the Global Classroom programme UCSC in 2021-22 (view excel sheet). The 10 weeks course work has been offered jointly by the faculty members of UCSC and RDWU.

The local shared that the beach is overcrowded not only with tourist but the through away plastic and glass bottles, cups, remaining food with container, polyethene and packets etc often washed away to the sea is a dangerous phenomenon. Especially the seabeach Jhaun jangle site picnic spots are found with leftover food and containers those litter to the sea water. The student exposure to the local fisher's community said that these micro-plastics negatively impact human health due to consumption of marine organisms by humans. In addition to all these impacts, the marine debris and beach litter pose dangers to wildlife on the beaches and marine ecology. Hence, in view of this our student's awareness programm to clean and blue beach was an admirable initiative.

CONSULTATION WORKSHOP ON DRAFT ODISHA STATE TRANSGENDER PERSONS POLICY 2021

With evolving understandings of sexual orientation and gender identity, public policy has been confronted with questions of how to improve the draft policy and make decisions based on new conceptions of sex and gender for transgender community. The decision of transgender person to openly discuss their gender identity or sexual orientation should be taken seriously and dealt with cautiously. Research demonstrates that the support provided to transgender individuals, specifically during the transition process, is essential to their relationship building and experience in the education and workplace. Further, Insights into both administrative and pedagogical approaches to supporting transgender students in schools which rely on a fundamental rationality of individualisation and rights.

To increase the visibility of trans-youth in schools and a growing awareness of their experiences about the institutional and systemic barriers questions the nature of inclusivity of transgender students in the education system. The panel members of this jointly organized virtual meeting today I hope will give insights into how transgender inclusion and recognition will be conceived in the draft policy and enacted in the schools of Odisha.

In the consultative roundtable virtual meeting a list of concerns has been documented which required concrete policy framework Today discussion will address the issue of accessibility, Freedom of Expression, Dignity and life without violence, Equal access to education, equal access to health services, employment opportunities and livelihoods, right to family life,, homestead, land and housing, food security, facilitation in transportation, special schemes for welfare of transgender personnel, social security and inclusion, state level transgender welfare board, grievance redressal mechanism. However, the educational policy concerns about the access to Primary and Higher Education and inclusion of subjects and concepts on Transgender in school curriculum which will be discussed in detail.

In view of this an increasing number of contemporary research publications acknowledge the influence of religion, culture, and gender on transgender personnel to exercise their rights. Rights to their life, liberty, and the security; the right to health care and information; and the right to non-discrimination in the allocation of resources and health services and in their availability and accessibility. Of central importance are the rights to autonomy and privacy in making sexual decisions.

Hence the existence of transgender human rights to education in policy planning or in a syllabus or content are merely not enough. But how subjective and gender sensitive are the content. Education can impact the stereotype and ideology of male and female and promote gender responsive reproductive health behaviour. The question is who teaches the content? Are they culturally sensitive and gender-neutral? It depends upon the teacher and trainer the way the teacher teaches and deliver the knowledge, either it will reenforced the power politics and male domination than management of reproductive health and learning value. So, the attitude with which the content is delivered with guilt with cultural colour and solution from a cultural attribute to procreate the perspectives. Further, the right to say no is not very prominent as the gendered society has silenced their voice in their identity and dignity. Transgender persons role has been ritualized, gendered and full of myths and romanticism is a complex situation. Choice condition, in which the transgender may choose a strategy to framework policy must be the States obligations to respect, protect and fulfil. Hence, the consultants emphasized the fundamental requisite of the study gender and intersectionality, practitioners to acknowledge religious heterogeneity and variability, and individuals' possibilities to negotiate the space.




Figure 21: Students of our department participated as volunteers in PRENA Ceremony organised by SWABHIMAN FOUNDATION an NGO at Panthaniwas on 13th Oct 2022.
