RDWU gave the First citizen of India

Draupadi Murmu recently became as the 15th President of India by defeating Yashwant Sinha, opposition candidate. Draupadi Murmu, aged 64, has become the first tribal President and second female President of India. She is also the first President, belong to Odisha. She was born in Mayurbhanj district in Odisha, in the Santhal tribal community. She was born on June 20, 1958 and has become the youngest President of India. In 1997, she became the vice-chairperson of Rairangpur NAC. Then she passed her graduation from Ramadevi Women's College, Bhubaneswar. During 1979 to 1983, she worked as a junior assistant in irrigation department of Odisha. She was married to Shyam Charan Murmu. She is also India's first president to be born af-



ter Independence. In 1997, she got elected as councillor of Rairangpur district in Odisha. Later in 1998, she became the vice-chairperson of Rairangpur NAC. Between 2000-2002, she was the transport and commerce minister in Odisha government. In 2007, she received the 'Neelakantha Award' for best MLA of the year. She became the 1st women governor of Jharkhand. Spiritually she is attached with the Brahma Kumari sector. Murmu bagged votes from a total

of 2824 electors, including 540 MPs, while her rival Sinha got votes of 1,877 electors including 208 MPs in the election. Murmu got the maximum votes from Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh while Sinha's tally was highest in West Bengal and Tamil Nadu. With each MP having a vote value of 700 in this presidential election, Murmu had a total vote value of 5,23,600 which is 72.19 per cent of the total valid vote count of MPs polled.

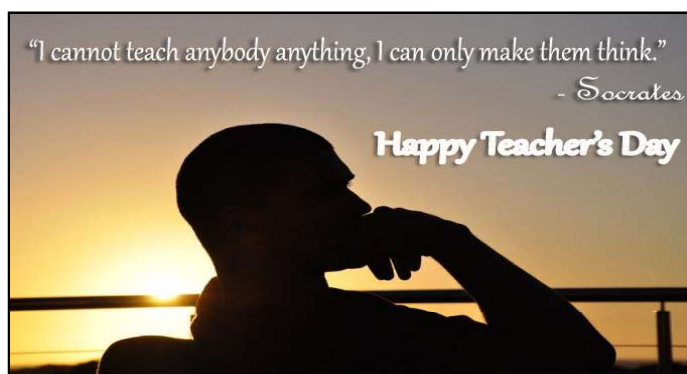

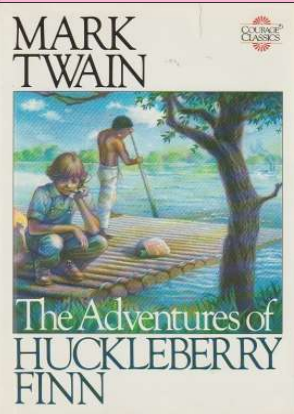
Movie Review
