Seminars/FDPs/Workshops organized

1. Date: 25/06/2022

Topic: Financial Education on Indian Capital Market & Wealth Management

Speaker: Raghunandan Pattnaik, National Trainer, BFSI, Financial Wizard

Participants: UG, PG students and Faculty members of Economics Dept.

Summary: The main objective of this webinar is how students build their career in financial market and make their financial planning early by investing in stocks, bonds, mutual funds, gold, securities etc. He advised not to invest in stocks where there is unrealistic guaranteed returns. Finally, he encouraged to create wealth for financial needs in future.

2. Date: 15/07/2022

Topic: One day Panel Discussion on the Odisha State Budget 2022-23: An Analysis Resource Person:

- a) Sri Panahanan Kanungo (former Finance Minister, Govt. of Odisha),
- b) Dr. Pravas Mishra (Assistant Manager, Research & Knowledge Management, OXFAM)
- c) Dr. Aparajita Biswal (HOD, PG Dept. of Economics, RDWU, Bhubaneswar) had joined as a key-note speaker for the Panel Discussion.

Participants: UG, PG students and Faculty members of Economics Dept.

Summary: The Panel Discussion began with the welcome address by Dr Kalpana Sahoo, Assistant Professor in Economics, RDWU. Prof. Sasmita Mohanty, CPGC & Vice Chancellor (in-charge), RDWU, delivered the inaugural address to the gathering while encouraging the students to take special interest in the Budget.

Dr Biplab Kumar Guru, Assistant Professor in Economics, RDWU, provided a brief overview of Odisha Budget 2022-23.Moreover, he also critically detailed out the Budget trends and patterns over the years. He raised concern over shrinking share of tax revenue vis-a-vis non-tax revenue of the state. SriPanahanan Kanungo began his talk by congratulating the Department for holding panel discussion on such an important topic of concern. Sri Kanungo, with more than four decades of experience in policy making and praxis, shared his thoughts on Odisha Budget 2022-23. According to him the Odisha Budget has gone through a sea change in the last couple of decades as has been noticed in a typical Odia village. He likened the Budget to Newton's Law and said a Budget can only yield good result when it works in synergy. He blamed the new tax regime – Good and Service Tax – for dwindling tax buoyancy of the state. He concluded his talk by emphasizing the role of the welfare state, while equating it to a mother, in protecting the vulnerable social groups, gender and needy through the progressive Budget allocation.


Dr. Pravas Mishra began by drawing attention to the ongoing Sri Lankan crisis, and what it suggests about the ill management of the state finance. He pointed out, however critically, some of the best practices in Odisha Budget making, be it Gender Budget or Climate Budget. Dr Mishra mentioned the various ways though the Budget get disbursed across various Departments and heads. He appealed the

students to use Budget as a tool, and not just only as a matter of intellectual exercise, to empower themselves and the society by engaging with the government.

Dr. Aparajita Biswaldelivered on "Odisha Budget 2022-23: A Gender Perspective." She commenced her talk by raising some of the concerns surrounding women in state. She pointed out that women in Odisha lag behind in almost all the indicators of wellbeing viz. health, education, social security, a few to mention. In such a situation, she mentioned, earmarking funds for women is though important but it is also vital to see that these funds really get materialized in the ground. She ascertained that the social accountability of the Budget can help in ensuring justice to the women.

Towards the end of the Panel Discussion, Mr. Pankaj Kumar Naik, Assistant Professor in Economics, RDWU, presented the report of the rapporteur to the gathering. Ms. Sumitra Sethy, Assistant Professor in Economics, RDWU, gave vote of thanks to all the participants. The Panel Discussion was attended by around 120 participants, including students, faculty members from the department and across all other departments and civil society members.

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3. Date: 23/07/2022

Topic: Child Malnutrition: A study on Odisha Venue: Room No-121 Academic Block-II

Speaker: Ms. Punyatoya Biswal, PhD student Dept. of Economics, RDWU, BBSR Participants: Dr. Sudhakar Patra, & Faculties of Dept. of Economics

Summary: The main objectives of this study is to examine the status of child malnuitrition and child health care in India and Odisha, to identify the factors explaining child malnuitrition in study areas, to access and evaluate the impact of ICDS on nutritional status of children. The study found that prevalence of underweight and wasting is high by 10% in Boudh district in comparison to Balasore district. From primary data analysis it is found that in Boudh district prevalence of underweight is 83%, stunting is 74% and wasting is 52% and in Balasore district 45.66%, 75% and 42.66% respectively. Factors found to be significantly associated with the prevalence of child malnutrition are mother's age at marriage, age of child, sex of the child, economic category, family income, education of the mother, occupation of the father, consumption pattern of the family, hygiene practices of the mother and children, food intake habits of mother and children and recurrent illness. In Boudh district 62.2% respondents are getting ICDS assistance. It is found that in Boudh district main cause of not availing ICDS service is unaraweness but in Balasore the main cause is found to be long distance to the AWCs.

4. Date: 03/08/2022

Topic: Career Launcher

Speaker: Pravanjan Mohanty, Mentor Career Launcher

Participants: UG and PG students of Dept.of Economics

Summary: Career counseling has been a part of the university's curriculum. Recently on 3rd August 2022 we had a career launcher institute with us on the dias. They enlighten the students about the current status and requirement of employment and provided ideas about a variety of courses like CAT, GMAT. They ensured students that with MBA course no individual would sit idle as MBA provides wide range of scope and opportunities. They ended the session with an offering i.e, interested students may enroll in their institute and have proper preparations for MBA entrances.

5. Date: 6.8. 2022

Topic: Coal Mining in Odisha: An analysis

Speaker: Prof. Mrutyunjay Mishra, Dept. of Economics, BHU Varanasi

Participants: UG, PG students and faculty members of the dept.

Summary: Prof. Mishra started his talk by analyzing the cost of coal mining on human health and agriculture in Talcher area in Odisha. In his talk he urged not to use single use plastic as some of it can't be recycled. He focused on the 3R principles i.e., reducing waste, reusing and recycling resources and products. Finally he discussed the outcome of his study that coal mining has negative impact on agriculture in nearby villages, respiratory illness is most prevalent health problem among individuals residing these areas. By his talk he suggested that a major initiation is required to control the environmental degradation by minimizing several aspects of pollution.

6. Date: 8.8. 2022

Topic: Challenges in Managing an Emerging Market Currency

Speaker: G. C. Nath, Dean School of Economics, Xaviers University

Participants: UG, PG students and faculty members of the dept.

Summary: This talk focused on how lingering Covid-19 pandemic and Russia's invasion of Ukraine affecting global economy through trade, commodity prices and financial flows to change current account deficit and surpluses. It also discussed about the central bank's monetary policy of major economies to control inflation.

His talk deeply focused on how Rate of RBI, Inter Bank Rate and Forex Reserves work to control inflation in India. Finally, he ended up his talk with reason for rupee depreciation and what can be done to control it.

7. Date: 15/10/2022

Topic: Invited Talk on "Awareness on Indian Capital Market"

Speaker: Mr. Soumya Ranjan Sahoo, BSE ISC, Bhubaneswar

Participants: UG, PG students and faculty members of the dept.

Output: The objective of this talk is to aware the students about the unauthorized brokers, who may not be SEBI registered entities and who can defraud. Always check for SEBI registration no of brokers. In his talk investors are requested to comply with the regulatory guidelines issues by exchanges and depositories from time to time with regard to KYC compliance and requirements.

Topic: student development program on "Global Crisis and India's strategic partnership"

Speaker: Dr. Kumar Satyaki Ray, Amity University, Kolkatta

Participants: UG, PG students and faculty members of the dept.

Summary: Dr Satyaki in his talk highlighted on the Russian incursion into Ukraine, the forced eviction of the ruling leadership in Srilanka and unending pandemic, how India has reached out it in multiple directions to maximize it's gains and interest. In his talk he focused on the context of India's philosophy to strategic partnership an overview of the global economic landscape.

9. Date: 06-07 February 2023

Topic: National Seminar on "Climate Change and Economic Growth: Challenges and Path Ahead"

Speaker: Faculty Members of Universities within/Outside the State

Participants: Students, scholars and Faculty Members of Universities within/Outside the State

Summary: The Department of Economics, Rama Devi Women's University, Bhubaneswar, organised a twoday national seminar on Climate Change and Economic Growth: Challenges and Path Ahead, during 6-7 February 2023. The seminar was funded by the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi. The main objectives of the seminar were to deliberate upon the complex nexus between climate change and economic growth, and to develop a consensus among the stakeholders on how not to push economic growth that engenders the environment and natural ecosystem. The seminar had invited research papers from the scholars, academicians and policy makers on ten broad themes concerning climate change and economic growth, cutting across various disciplines. The Department had received 38 inter-disciplinary research papers, of which 26 papers had been invited for the presentation. 22 research papers were presented in the twotechnical sessions of the seminar.
