**8. Objective of the Event (1–2 lines):** To collect data and information of grass root level women farmers in tribal villages.

**9. Brief Description of the Event (3–5 lines):** MRDCP along with the MRDC staff started their journey for *Koraput* on 1<sup>st</sup> Feb, 2026 evening at 7:35 p.m. and reached Koraput on 2<sup>nd</sup> Feb. They visited 3 tribal villages named Kemili, K.Lula, & Poghra and conducted Focus Group Discussion and in-depth interviews with tribal women and documented their stories. 45+ tribal women farmers were interviewed. A care-givers group at Integrated Development Society (IDS), Gouda Guda, Koraput were also interviewed for a special chapter. Jeeven Rekha Parishad (JRP) & IDS who is a collaborator in this has also provided us with ground support by connecting us with the women farmers by organizing meetings.

**11. Outcome of the Event (1-2 points):** We collected information regarding the farming styles, yield patterns, and the various issues faced by the farmers. We were deeply fascinated by the cleanliness of the village and the positive outlook of the tribal women. It was a unique experience to observe modern tribal women who are somewhat touched by modernization, yet remain deeply rooted in their culture and traditions. Their stories of resilience, struggle, and triumph were inspiring and distinct. We also visited their farms, which gave us insight into their agricultural practices and highlighted how women are predominantly involved in farming activities in these areas.


