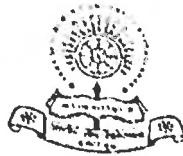

1. List of names were recommended for Board of Conducting Examiners, Moderation Board and Paper setters for UG (Arts/Science/Commerce)/PG and PhD Course work Examination 2022-23
2. List of examiners for PG/Ph.D. Coursework 202-23 were recommended
3. The revised syllabus prepared as per the new structure was placed and discussed in detail and modifications as suggested were made.

- The previous syllabus had four units in each paper.
- The revised syllabus as per the new structure has five units
- As per the new structure there are
  - Fourteen hard core papers (HC – 101,102,103, 104, 201, 202, 203, 204, 301, 302, 303, 401, 402, 403)
  - Four Core Elective papers (CE- 201, 301, 302, 401)
  - One Open elective paper to be offered in second semester (OE-201)
  - Two Allied Core paper.  
AC-101 to be offered in first semester will be Computer Application and will be offered by E-learning Centre.  
AC- 401 will be Women and Law and will be taught centrally for all departments
- The syllabus for the non-credit course to be introduced from the session 2022 was discussed and finalized. It was decided that the Department of English will offer a course on “Effective Writing and Reading Skill.”  
The course would be of 40 hours duration and the examination will be conducted by the department
- The Syllabus for UG and Ph.D Coursework was recommended
- The Chairperson discussed the pattern of Plus three degree (both odd and even) examination. The questions would be set as prescribed in the model syllabus
  - Mid-sem examination carrying 20 marks would have:  
One long analytical question of 10 marks each;  
Two short descriptive questions of 5 marks each.
- The Chairperson discussed the question pattern for PG examinations (both odd and even semester)  
End semester: Papers will be set for 70 marks.

Questions will be set from each unit (Either one long question of 14 marks each and two questions of 7 marks each)

Mark distribution will be as such inclusive of all units  
Long question – 14 (marks) X 5 (units) = 70 marks

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Total - 70

Mid-semester – 30 marks

In each paper questions will be set as per the following pattern

- a) two long questions of 10 marks each - 20 marks
- b) two questions of 5 marks each - 10 marks

CBCS M.A. (ENGLISH) SYLLABUS, 2019-2021

MA English course, under the CBCS system, is to offer the postgraduate student of English Literature both basic and specialized training at an advanced level. It is qualitatively different from the BA Honours course, in that it assumes that the student has already have a basic orientation to the study of English literature and are now committed to higher learning.

Students will be required to take nine compulsory or 'core' courses, and eight optional courses. The compulsory requirement will equip the student in the general field of English studies. The optional courses are intended to develop specific research or professional interests.

#### Optional courses

- Not all the optional courses listed below will be offered in any one year. The choice of options will depend on the availability of teachers and the interest shown by students.
- Optional courses may be added or deleted from time to time. These will be notified to the students through a decision of the Board of Studies approved by the Academic Council, Ramadevi Women's University.

Each paper comprises 100 marks: 20 marks internal exams and 80 marks end-semester exam

Each unit comprises of 20 marks: Two long questions of 8 marks each and one short question 4 marks.

The faculty members of other allied departments within the institution may also be included in the viva-voce panel with the prior permission of the authority. ✓

### Attendance

Students are required to participate in lectures, seminars, fieldwork and other research activities. They are required to attend at least 75% of the classes to appear in each semester. In case of medical health problem/ illness, the attendance requirement may be reduced to at least 60% only after providing satisfactory medical certificate.
