## **Report with photographs on ICT/ computing skills enhancement program**

The ICT/ Computing Skills Enhancement Program was initiated in the University for equipping students with the essential skills and knowledge required to thrive in the rapidly evolving digital landscape. Paper on Computer Application (Allied Core – 101) is made mandatory for all the Post Graduate students of the University. The paper intends to equip the students with proficiency in information and communication technology (ICT) and computing.

University has a dedicated computer centre to cater to the ICT related requirements of the students. The computer centre has the objectives of 1. improving students' proficiency in fundamental ICT concepts and applications; 2. enhancing students' problem-solving and critical thinking skills through hands-on computing activities; 3. fostering collaborative and supportive learning environment to encourage knowledge sharing and teamwork among the students, 4. preparing students for the challenges of the digital era; and 5. hone students employability skills in technology-driven industries.

University has signed Memorandum of Understandings (MoUs) with various organizations for the development of the students. 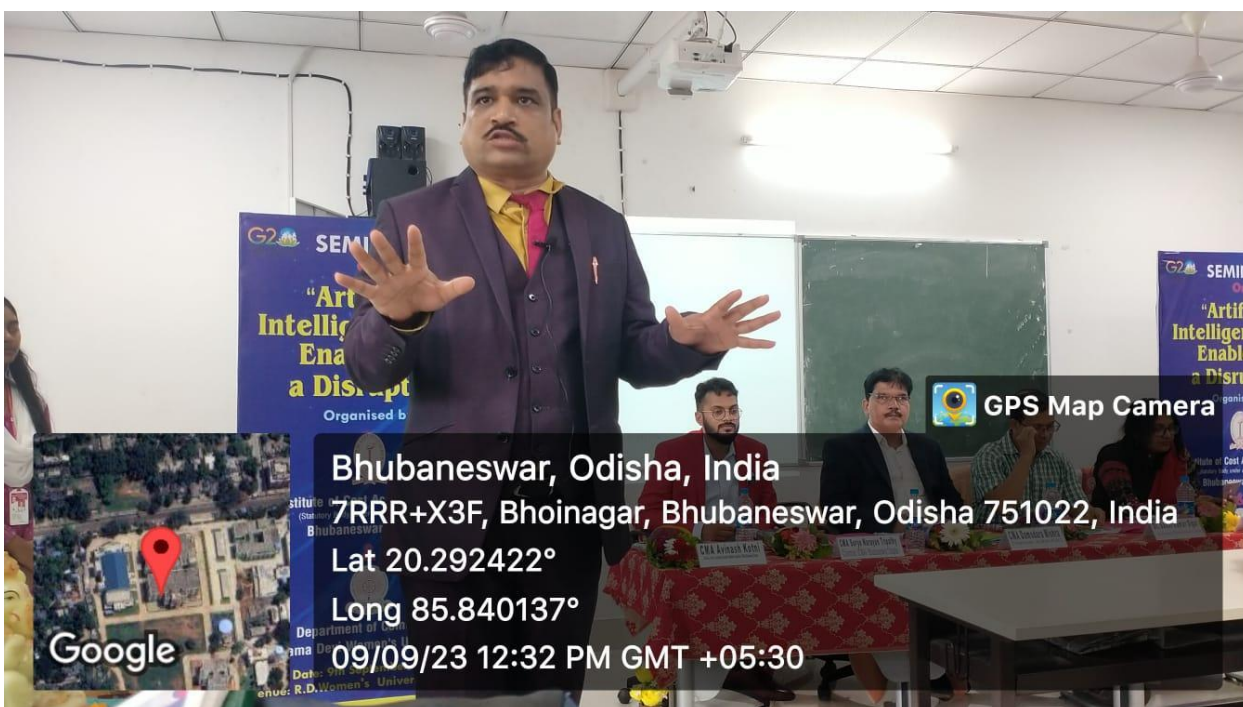

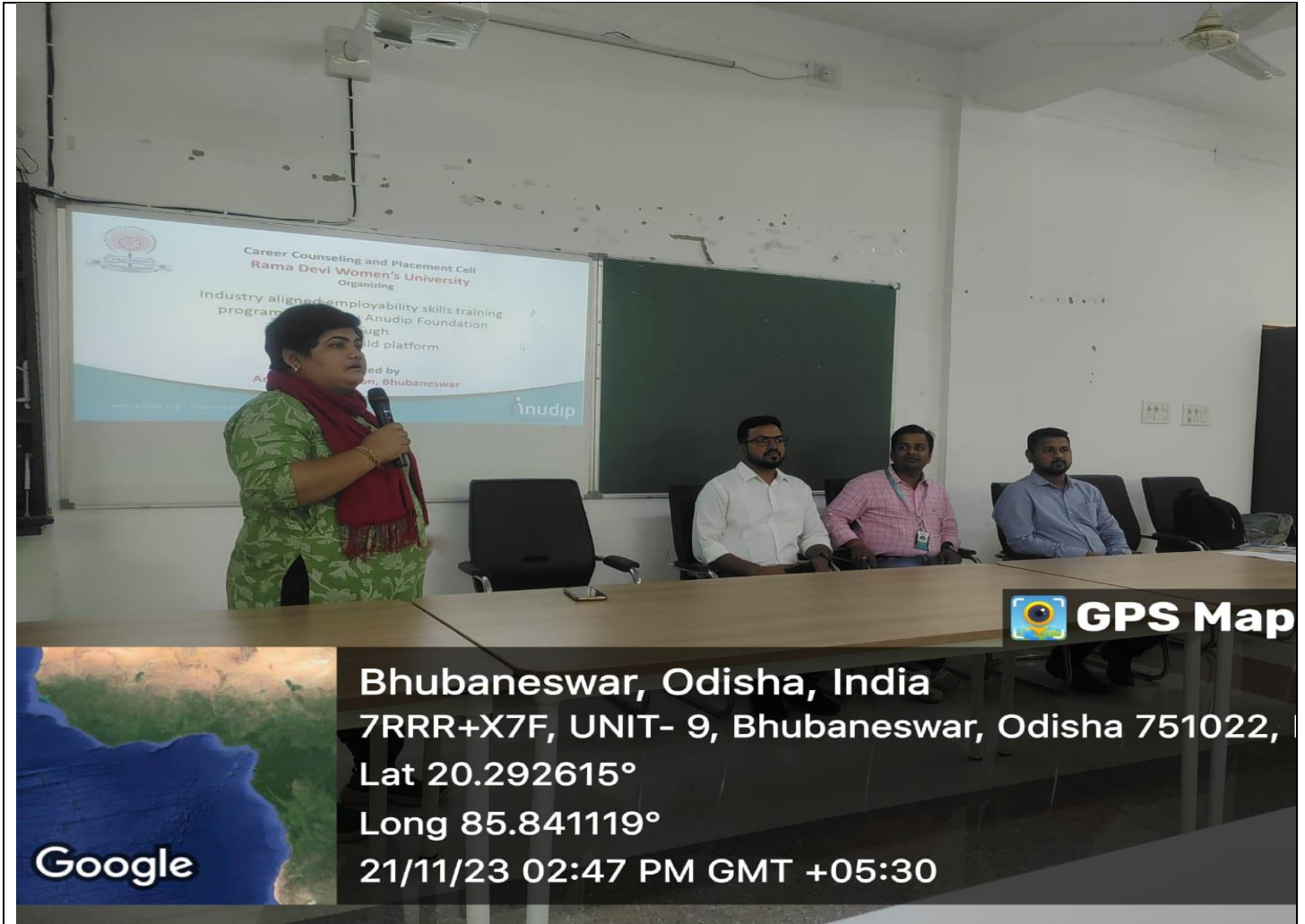


