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INTRODUCTION

Department of Gender Studies and Sarala Devi Centre for Gender Research of Rama Devi Women's University in collaboration with Policy Centre and Gender Lab, Miranda House, University of Delhi is organizing the 15 days Faculty Development Programme (FDP) entitled "The Gendered Contours of the Pandemic: Reinventing Public Policy and Leadership" to be held from 24th of August to 7th of September 2020 (at 4.30PM to 6.30PM).

MAJOR THEME

The 15 days Faculty Development Programme with a set of Keynote addresses and parallel sessions on each day has been designed to ensure enriching and learning experience for the participants by providing them with the contours of varied experiential learning and lived engagement both as individual and in group. A diverse panel of Experts on Gender discourses, Administrators, Grassroots and Local-self-government leaders will address the critical issues related to the emerging leadership during the COVID pandemic and the need for reinventing public policy and their application for gender justice to realize long-term outcomes. The FDP would cover wide ranging sub-themes related to the major theme throughout its sessions.

OUTCOMES

The participants had the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the listed topics from both conceptual as well as empirical perspective. The participants engaged in grouppresentation as a part of their FDP assignment. Beyond the assignment they could able to share their own experiences based on the themes, have interacted with the eminent feminists and resource persons, exercises, and a virtualfield visit. Each participant has received an E-certificate of participation after making a virtual group presentation of 10 minutes and successful completion of the FDP.

Prof. Padmaja Mishra is currently working as the Vice Chancellor of Rama Devi Women's University. She is the first Vice Chancellor of the first ever women's University of the Odisha. She is a professor of Economics and has about 35 years of experience in teaching and research at Utkal University. With a brilliant academic career and having postgraduate and MPhil degree from Utkal university, she has done her Ph.D. at University of East Anglia, United Kingdom and Post-doctoral work at University of Maryland, USA. She has got the recognition as South Asian Research Fellow by Social Science Research council, New York. She has been a visiting professor at different reputed Universities around the world. She has guided much research works and has many papers and edited books to her credit. She has wide experience as an academic administrator as Head of the P.G. Department of Economics, as Director, Women's Studies, and dean of Humanities at Utkal University. She has also working as chairperson and expert member of many committee. As the first Vice-Chancellor of Rama Devi Women's University, she is dedicated to building the University and creating the opportunities for women in higher education.



Prof. (Dr.) Asha HansPresident, Sansristi Founder Director, School of Women's Studies, Utkal University, Bhubaneswar

Asha Hans is Co-chair, Pakistan India People's Forum for Peace, and Democracy; former Professor of Political Science, and Founder Director, School of Women's Studies, Utkal University, India. A leading campaigner of women's rights, she has participated in the formulation of many conventions in the United Nations. She is the President of Sansristi—a gender resource centre. Her recently published books include 'Disability, Gender and the Trajectories of Power '(2015) and 'The Gender Imperative: Human Security vs State Security ' (with Betty Reardon, 2010). Her writings argue for the rights of women with disabilities, who live on the periphery of society, and seeks to eradicate the exclusion and stigma that are part of their lives. It brings together the perspectives of academicians and activists in trying to understand the various social issues faced by women with disabilities and argues for a society where they are not denied respect, equality, and justice. Filling the gap in the existing feminist research, her books seek to influence the way in which society treats women with disabilities and will be of interest to scholars and researchers in the field of women's rights, disability rights, and rehabilitation.

Dr. Bijayalaxmi Nanda, acting principal, Miranda house is an Associate Professor in the Department of Political Science. An alumna of Jawaharlal Nehru University, her research interests span beyond gender, political theory, human rights, and sensitization. She has several acclaimed books and research articles in reputed journals to her credit including, 'Discourse on Rights in India: Debates and Dilemmas (Co-editor), (Routledge, London, 2018), Sex-Selective Abortion and the State: Policies, Laws and Institutions in India (HarAnand, 2018), Understanding Social Inequality: Concerns of Human

Rights, Gender and Environment (Co- editor) (Macmillan, 2010) etc. Also, a recipient of the ICSSR Doctoral fellowship and the Delhi University Vice Chancellor's Teacher's Excellence Award in 2017, She has been actively associated with several government and non-government organisations as advisor on gender, policy and advocacy programmes for the youth. She has assisted various state governments in drafting policy related to women and girl child. As a policy analyst she has extensively analysed the public policies relating to family planning, human trafficking, Conditional Cash Transfers for the girl-child, housing for women, etc. She is a member of the Advisory Committee on PC-PNDT Act of the Government of NCT of Delhi. She has been a research advisor to the National Commission for Women (NCW) and a member of the core committee on the issue of sex- selective abortion, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India. She has extensively travelled in India and abroad in connection with her academic, research and activist pursuits, including to the USA, the UK, France, Belgium, Sweden, Brazil, Bangladesh and Nepal. Area of interest: gender, political theory, human rights, and sensitization, social inequality, gender and environment.

Prof. Balram Pani, Dean, University of Delhi, Principal of Bhaskaracharya College of Applied Sciences, is also a faculty in the Department of Chemistry, University of Delhi. He obtained his PhD from Jawaharlal Nehru University. Prof. Pani has 20 years of research and teaching experience in the field of chemistry and Environmental Science. He has also authored various books on Environmental Science and Engineering chemistry, which have been adopted by several universities, and engineering and science colleges. He received "Most Promising Innovation" award for the project entitled "To explore the potential of biosimilars as cost-effective therapeutic products(Appendix A305)" sponsoredby DU Innovation Project, (2015-16). He has a number of research publications ranging over a diversefield and area of interest to his credit. Prof. (Dr.) Pooran Chand Joshi, the 23rd Pro-Vice Chancellor of University of Delhi is a Professor of Social Anthropology at the Department of Anthropology, University of Delhi, India. His area of specialization is Medical Anthropology and he focuses on Anthropology of Disasters, Anthropology of Development and on issues related to Social Exclusion and Adverse Inclusion. Prof. Joshi was a delegate of the European Union at the United Nations Framework Climate Change Conference held at Poznan, Poland in 2008. Prof. Joshi was the first president of the Society for Indian Medical Anthropology and Executive Member of the Ethnographic and Folk Culture Society based in Lucknow, India. P. C. Joshi has also been a recipient in 1987 of the Indira Priyadarshini Vriksha Mitra National Award as a founder member of Friends of Trees, and the Inter-University Centre Associateship Award in Humanities and Social Sciences, 1996-1999, Certificate of Honour at the First France-India Meet on Psychiatry, Psychoanalysis and Psychotherapy, 2007, Plaque of Appreciation from Department of Sociology and Anthropology, Xavier University Ateneo de Cagayan de Oro City, Philippines, 2008, and Certificate of Appreciation on his research on disaster impacts in Asia and Europe by Faculty of Public Health, University of Indonesia in 2009, among other honours and distinctions. Prof. Joshi has co-authored nine books, over 157 articles, book chapters and reviews in area of Medical Anthropology, Traditional Medicines, Shamanism, Impact of Disasters, Life Style Diseases and Antibiotic Resistance. He has worked on many research projects and submitted over 14 research reports to various funding agencies and government policy planning agencies.




Figure No1 & 2. FDP Inaugural sessions speakers of day one 24th August 2019.




Figure No.3: Day 2, FDP parallel session 25 August 2020.




Figure No.4: Day five, FDP parallel session 29 August 2020.




Figure No.7: Day 5, FDP parallel session 29 August 2020.




Figure No.8: Day 6, FDP parallel session 30 August 2020.
