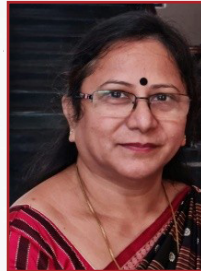

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About the College Development Council (CDC)

The University Grants Commission (UGC) introduced the concept of the College Development Council (CDC) in the 1980s, envisioning it as a strategic interface between the UGC and colleges affiliated with various universities. The primary mandate of CDCs at the university level was to facilitate comprehensive planning and ensure the effective execution of development initiatives supported by the UGC, universities, and other funding bodies, with the overarching goal of enhancing the quality of affiliated colleges and institutions. Additionally, CDCs were tasked with providing essential guidance and support to these institutions.

In alignment with this vision, Rama Devi Women's University, Bhubaneswar, established its College Development Council in 2015. The Council is chaired by the Vice Chancellor, with the Director of the College Development Council serving as Convenor. Its membership includes the Regional Director of Education, Bhubaneswar, and the principals of all 48 affiliated colleges. The university's network of colleges comprising one autonomous institution & other colleges that span nine districts across Odisha, contributing significantly to higher education in disciplines such as humanities and social sciences, science and technology, commerce and management studies, and pedagogical sciences.



Vision

To foster academic excellence and holistic institutional development by providing strategic support, coordination, and guidance for quality enhancement and resource mobilization to the affiliated colleges.

Mission

- To coordinate and monitor development activities of affiliated colleges.
- To assist in the preparation and implementation of development plans.
- To promote academic collaboration, research, and innovation.
- To ensure quality assurance through continuous assessment and capacity building.
- To facilitate funding and infrastructural support from government and external agencies.

Function of the Council

- Functions as a policy making body in regard to proper planning and integrated development of the colleges.
- Conducts surveys of all the affiliated colleges for considering affiliation to new colleges & programmes, and the continuation of provisional/grant of permanent affiliation for existing programmes.
- Advises the University on all matters relating to development of affiliated colleges.
- Prepares perspective plan for the development and opening of new colleges;
- Advises University in regard to rationalisation and implementation of the University Policy on affiliation of colleges.
- Helps Colleges in their proper development, selection of teachers, proper utilization of grants, efficient implementation of guidelines of University Grants Commission on examinations, courses, etc.
- Assists the colleges to prepare the proposal and forward the proposal to UGC for inclusion of colleges under 2(f) & 12 (B) of UGC Act 1956, grant/extension of autonomous status, etc.
- Helps in the implementation of regulations framed by the University Grants Commission regarding academic standards and restructuring of courses at the undergraduate level.
- Evaluates and assesses the impact of grants of University Grants Commission and ensures timely release of grant of University Grants Commission to the colleges and its proper utilization.
- Ensure close and continued contact and interaction between the academic faculties of the University and those of the colleges through faculty development programmes and other meetings as per requirement.
- Reviews inspection reports of the Colleges and take remedial steps.
- Prepares annual report on the functioning of the College Development Council and performs such other functions as may be prescribed by the University with a view to advancing the course of collegiate education.
- Encourages and extends expert advice and assistance to colleges for NAAC accreditation and reaccreditation.

As approved in the 30th Meeting of the Syndicate of RDWU, held on 21.08.2024, the University has granted Temporary Affiliation to 43 colleges offering 3-Year Bachelor Degree Programs in Arts, Science and Commerce. 1. The affiliated colleges must update their recognition status and submit valid documentary evidence of the same on or before 31st January, 2025, as per the resolution approved in the Affiliation Committee meeting held on 10.07.2024.
2. Failure to comply with this condition will result in revocation of the temporary affiliation.

The recognition copy from the Office of the Regional Director of Education, Bhubaneswar is currently awaited.
2. Shri Ranjit Kumar Pradhan, Regional Director of Education, Bhubaneswar along with Dr. Itishri Sarangi, Asso. Prof. in English & Dr. Sasmita Kar, HoD, Education visited Mahanga Women's Degree College, Pallisahi, Cuttack on 15.04.2025 for the purpose of granting Permanent Recognition and Affiliation to the college. The college was granted Permanent Affiliation by Rama Devi Women's University vide Notification No. 4557, dated 28.07.2025.

3. Affiliation Committee Meeting:

A meeting of the Affiliation Committee was convened on 10.07.2024 to discuss and resolve various issues and challenges faced by the affiliated colleges. The meeting aimed to ensure smooth functioning and improve the overall quality of education in these institutions.

Proceedings of the meeting held on 10.07.2024

The meeting of the Affiliation Committee of Rama Devi Women's University, Bhubaneswar was held on 10.07.2024 at 03:30 pm in the VC's Board Room of the University with the Vice Chancellor Prof. Aparajita Chowdhury, in the chair.

Matters discussed and resolutions made:

At the outset Prof. Sasmita Mohanty, Director, CDC offered a hearty welcome to the members of the Committee and apprised the members about purpose of the meeting. Subsequently the Committee transacted its business as per agenda items. After threadbare discussion the following resolutions were passed in the meeting.

1. Affiliation issues of the Colleges till 2023-24

Director, CDC apprised the esteemed members regarding the directive received from the Higher Education Department (Letter No. 23380/HE dated 13.06.2024) indicating that the colleges not having updated affiliation would not be able to admit students from the academic session 2024-25 and it was observed that only 11 out of the 48 affiliated colleges possess updated recognition status to be able to get affiliation till 2023-24. The matter was discussed and the following was resolved:

- The colleges not having updated recognition may be granted Temporary Affiliations till the session 2023-24 with the condition that those should get their recognition updated and submitted documentary evidence to that effect latest by 31 October, 2024. The affiliation notification may be ratified in the next Syndicate.

2. Affiliation issue of the programmes running on the PPP mode in the Shailabala Women's Auto. College, Cuttack

The committee discussed the following:

1. Four numbers of programmes in PPP mode (BSc (ITM), MBA, M.Com (F & C) and MSW) are being conducted in Shailabala Women's Autonomous College, Cuttack since the academic session 2023-24.
2. The college has opened the programmes, in pursuance of Government order vide no. 7382/HE dt. 22.02.2024. AICTE approval for MBA programme has been obtained for the session 2024-25.

It was resolved that:

- As the courses running under PPP mode have already started since 2023, and students have already completed one year in the meantime, affiliation of the said courses for the session 2023-24 may be granted upon the physical inspection by the competent team. Subsequent continuation of admission to these courses from the session 2024-25 will be decided as per the report of the inspection team upon examination of adherence to stipulated norms.
- A letter to the Government may be moved stating that the University should be consulted while giving permission to open programmes in PPP mode in the affiliated colleges.

3. Fee structure for the Govt. Colleges

Director, CDC discussed with the esteemed members about the existing fee structure mentioned in the affiliation booklet and apprised the members that there is no mention about affiliation fees for Govt. Colleges. Hence it was resolved that the existing fee structure shall be henceforth applicable to all the colleges (Government and Non-Government). However the stipulation regarding Pledge Money shall be applicable only to Non-Government Colleges and not to Government Colleges.

4. Grant of Permanent Affiliation

The committee resolved the following:

1. Temporary affiliation shall be accorded to the colleges for a maximum period of 10 year.
2. Thereafter, the colleges shall be granted either permanent affiliation if it fulfils the eligibility or shall be disaffiliated if it does not meet the standards.
3. Such grant Permanent affiliation shall be granted subject to the condition that the colleges concerned must have secured Permanent Recognition from the government beforehand.
4. It was also suggested that a proposal from the RDE, Bhubaneswar may be given for joint inspection of the RDE, Bhubaneswar and the University for grant of recognition and affiliation of the college, so that both the processes would be easier and less time consuming.

5. Bifurcation of +2 and +3 programmes of the colleges

Director, CDC informed the committee that out of the 48 (forty eight) colleges affiliated under the University, 17 (seventeen) are running as composite colleges, catering to the requirements of +2 and +3 programmes in terms of same infrastructure as well as same teaching staff with a Principal looking after both the programs. This adversely affects the teaching-learning environment, given the inadequacy of the resources to support the programmes. The committee requested the RDE, Bhubaneswar to take necessary steps in the Department of Higher Education for complete bifurcation of + 2 and + 3 Colleges in terms of infrastructure and manpower.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

The Awareness Program was organized in two sessions:

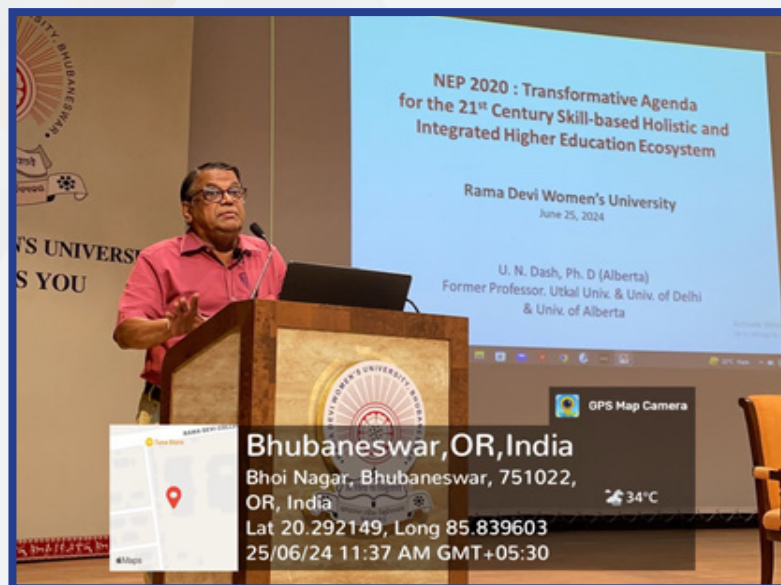
Pre-launch session

a. College Development Council

The Director, CDC discussed the Recognition and affiliation status of the Colleges. The colleges were instructed to submit the Recognition copy till 2023-24 for which the affiliation can be done. The Director, CDC also requested the principals to submit the CDC fees, affiliation fees and booklet fees timely. Principals of all the affiliated Colleges were also requested to deposit the above fees by 31st July every year.

b. Examination Section

The Controller of Examination discussed about the rules and regulations of examination pattern and syllabus. She deliberated upon the timely completion of the mid-semester examinations and the entry of marks thereof within the specified timeline. Timely dispatch and mode of answer scripts to the University and the arrangement of externals for the practical examinations and valuation of the examination was also discussed.

c. NSS

The Programme Coordinator, NSS discussed about the different activities to be undertaken by the NSS units at College level. He advised to apply for opening of new NSS Unit for the college not having the NSS unit and organization of Special Camp every year timely. He requested to the principals of all affiliated Colleges to submit the social service fees in time.

d. NAAC

The NAAC Coordinator, Affiliated Colleges discussed about the NAAC status of the Colleges and rule and regulation of the NAAC. He also discussed about the benefit of the implementation of NAAC in the educational institution. He advised to all the principals to prepare for the NAAC in their Colleges by inspirational examples. The meeting ended with a formal vote of thanks, proposed by Director, CDC, RDWU.

B. Meeting on Implementation of NEP-2020 Curriculum at UG Level

A meeting of Principals of all affiliated colleges, along with the Heads of Departments (HODs) and Coordinators of Rama Devi Women's University, Bhubaneswar was conducted on 8th November, 2024 at 11:30 AM at the Rama Devi Auditorium.

The meeting was organized by the College Development Council in collaboration with the Office of the Controller of Examinations (CoE), Rama Devi Women's University. The focus of the meeting was "Implementation of NEP-2020 Curriculum at the Undergraduate Level".

The objective of the meeting was to discuss effective strategies, academic planning, and structural reforms required for the successful adoption of the NEP-2020 framework in undergraduate programs across the University and its affiliated colleges.

Prof. Sasmita Mohanty, Director, CDC welcomed the members and initiated the discussion. Prof. Chandi Charan Rath, Coordinator NEP and Chairperson PG Council threw light on the important aspects of NEP-2020. Prof. Aparajita Chowdhury, Vice-Chancellor appraised the august house about the future perspectives of NEP-2020 to be implemented from 2024-2025 and also on the importance of Internship and SEC. Dr. Mamata Mohanty, Controller of Examinations discussed about the course structures, distribution of marks and the question pattern suggested in the Regulation for UG Curriculum as per NEP-2020.

After a threadbare discussion following resolutions were made.

1. The colleges were advised to constitute a course counseling cell in the institution to aware the students about the courses of NEP-2020.
2. Multidisciplinary, SEC and VAC Courses are to be selected from the basket of the courses suggested by the University as per the recommendation of BOS. Colleges are advised to opt the courses as per their affiliation and availability of faculty.
3. The facility to provide online SEC Courses offered by NASCOM etc. may be extended to the colleges.
4. The Principals and HODs were advised to aware the students about the regulation at the institution and departments level.

5. It was decided that the University will develop the curriculum for B.Sc. IT which was not supplied by OSHEC and the draft syllabi will be sent to OSHEC for approval from the subject expert.
6. All the members are advised to take initiatives in creation of ABC ID of each student including the students admitted in the Session 2024-25.
7. It was advised to fill up the details of the student data like ABC ID, Aadhaar No., Core subject etc.in ROI with accuracy and try to complete the syllabus of the 1st semester by taking some extra classes. So that the examination can be conducted by the Last week of January or 1st Week of February.
8. It was resolved that the university is prepared to implement the new structure and curriculum w.e.f. 2024-25 as soon as the Higher Education Department, Govt. of Odisha issues instructions to that effect.

5. FDP on NEP Orientation and Sensitization

A collaborative orientation cum Sensitization Programme was organized by SGBT Khalsa College, University of Delhi and Rama Devi Women's University, Bhubaneswar from 18th to 28th February 2025 under the aegis of Guru Angad Dev- Malviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (GAD-MMTTC). The Programme was Coordinated by College Development Council and conducted in online mode daily on ZOOM from 5:00 PM to 8:00 PM. The Programme received a huge response and over 300 registrations were received out of which only 200 participants were allowed to participate due to the paucity of the platform. Around 63 participants registered were from RDWU and its constituent colleges.

The Object of this sensitization course on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 was to :

- i. Equip teachers with a comprehensive understanding of the policy's transformative vision and its practical implications for classroom practices.
- ii. Introduce educators to key pillars such as holistic, multidisciplinary education, competency-based learning, and the emphasis on critical thinking, creativity, and vocational skills.
- iii. Familiarize teachers with pedagogical shifts, including flexible curricula, experiential learning, and the integration of technology to foster student-centered classrooms.
- iv. Address foundational literacy and numeracy goals, early childhood education frameworks, and strategies for inclusive, multilingual education to cater to diverse learners.
- v. Clarify assessment reforms, such as moving from rote memorization to formative evaluations, and highlight the importance of continuous professional development.
- vi. Empower teachers to align their methodologies with NEP 2020's objectives, fostering equitable, future-ready education systems by bridging policy and practice
