Preamble: UGC PARAMARSH Scheme, as a part of the Quality Mandate, University Grants Commission (UGC) has set goaltogeteveryHigherEducationInstitution(HEI)NAAC accredited. Inorder to achieve this goal, introduced a new scheme 'PARAMARSH' with the main objective to enhance the overall quality of the Mentee in stitutions by MentoringtheNon-Accredited Higher Education Institutions to enable them to get accredited. Mentoring shall be imparted through the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the Mentor Institutions, which shall be primarily responsible for the implementation of the program.

Rama Devi Women's University (RDWU) was established in 2015 vide Government of Odisha, Department of Higher Education Notification No. HE-FE-I-B-MISC-9/2015/11605/HE dated 30.05.2015 in exercise of power conferred by sub-section (1) & (2) of section 32 of Odisha University Act, 1989 (Odisha Act 5 of 1989). The University was also empowered to award Degrees as specified by the UGC Under Section 22 of the UGC Act 1956 through its own departments, its constituent Colleges and/or through its affiliated colleges in regular mode vide UGC letter No.F-9-3/2015 (CPP-1/PU) dated 11.05.2016.

At present the University has U.G, P.G., PhD., Certificate, and Skill enhancement courses in its credit during short period of time. This University is unique one in view that it is the only Women University in the State of Odisha having 48 affiliated Women's Colleges covering 09 districts of the State. It also fulfils the aspirations of girls of not only in the state but also in its nearby states to pursue their career in Higher Education.

One Day NAAC Awareness-Cum-Training Programme under UGC PARAMARSH Schemefor Non-Accredited Higher Education Institutions under Revised Accreditation Framework was held on 30th September 2021 in collaboration with KIIT, deemed to be University under the presidentship of Prof. Aparajita Chowdhury, Vice Chancellor, RDWU. The meeting was attended by principals & IQAC coordinators of affiliated colleges, members od IQAC, RDWU and faculty members of RDWU. The program was inaugurated by lighting of lamp, and paying floral tribute to maa Rama Devi. The Welcome address was given by Prof. Chandi Charan Rath, Director, IQAC, RDWU, followed by Guest introduction by Prof. Sasmita Mohanty, Chairperson, P.G. Council, and Address by Smt. Shyamali Mohapatra, Registrar,

RDWU. Prof. Asoka Kumar Das, Vice-Chairperson, Odisha State Higher Education Council, Prof. SasmitaSamanta, Pro Vice-Chancellor, KIIT Deemed to be University, and Prof. Aparajita Chowdhury, Vice-Chancellor, RDWU, addressed the august gathering, emphasizing on the objective of the programme to sensitize the principals and IQAC Coordinators of all affiliated colleges on the criteria to apply for NAAC accreditation. The inaugural programme was concluded by a formal vote of thanks to the chair by Prof. Jayanta Kumar Parida, Director, school of commerce KIIT, Deemed to be University.

The inaugural session was followed by Technical Sessions. There were three technical sessions as follows:

Technical Session-I

This session was handled by Prof. Asoka Kumar Das, Vice-Chairperson, Odisha State Higher Education Council, Govt. of Odisha. He discussed the aspects on Key Features of Revised Accreditation Framework and Eligibility Criteria, The Process for Assessment and Accreditation, Institutional Information for Quality Assessment, Registration Process, IIQA Application and application process, Documents for Colleges/University, Process of online submission of Self-Study Report (SSR), Profile of the Institution, Criteria and Key Indicators with its Weightages, Focus on Stakeholders, Optional Metrics, Data Validation and Verification (DVV) Process, Standard Operating Procedure for Data Validation and Verification, Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) Process and Pear team composition.

Prof. Das suggested the following key points:

- All colleges should host dynamic Website and update the requisite information for NAAC Accreditation.
- All college Principals should encourage their young faculty members to complete PhD. degree within 3-4 years and felicitate them by organising felicitation ceremony.
- To encourage faculty members to do research publications in SCOPUS, Web of Science, and SCI Journals. Felicitate them those who have highest number of publications.
- Submit Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) report in every year and update in college Website.

The Technical Session-I was followed by Lunch Break.

Technical Session-II

This session was conducted by Prof. Ranjan Kumar Bal, Former, Chair Person PG Council, and Director IQAC, Utkal University. He discussed in detail on NAAC Revised Assessment and Accreditation Framework (RAF). He covered the aspects like List of documents required to be uploaded, Queries related to IIQA, SSR

with dedicated Help Desk, IIQA Application Process, Changes Introduced in RAF, SSR Submission process and readiness, Newly introduced Key Indicators and Distribution of Metrics and Key Indicators across Criteria. He had also elaborated on the Curricular aspects viz. Curriculum Planning and Implementation, Academic Flexibility, Curriculum Enrichment, Feedback System; Teaching-Learning and Evaluation criteria viz. Student Enrolment and Profile, Catering to Student Diversity, Teaching -Learning Process, Teacher Profile and Quality, Evaluation Process and Reforms, Student Performance and Learning Outcomes, Student Satisfaction Survey; Research, Innovation and Extension aspects viz. Resource Mobilization for Research, Innovation Ecosystem, Research Publications and Awards, Extension Activities and Collaborations; Infrastructure and Learning Resources viz. Physical facilities, Library as a Learning Resource, IT Infrastructure, Maintenance of Campus Infrastructure.

Technical Session-III

This session was conducted by Prof. Jayanta Kumar Parida, Director, School of Commerce & Economics, KIIT Deemed to be University. He further, discussed on Library Automation System, Student Support and Progression, Institutional Values and Best Practices, QIF metric and DVP report. Importance of contributions for Made in India, Swaccha Bharat, Digital India, and Start-up India ventures were also included in his discussion.

Technical Session - IV (Panel Discussion)

A discussion session was carried out to answer the queries raised by the participants. The experts on the dais were Prof. Aparajita Chowdhury, Vice Chancllor, RDWU, Prof. Jayanta Parida, Director, School of Commerce and Economics, KIIT Deemed to be University, Prof. Ranjan Kumar Bal and prof Chandi Charan rath, director, IQAC, RDWU. All the sessions were run in interactive mode. A number ofqueries were asked by the participants and duly answered by the Expets.

The awareness programme ended with vote of thanks offered by Dr. Sankar Prasad Mohanty, Coordinator, IQAC, Rama Devi Women's University.





Organized National seminar on "Gendered Contours of the Pandemic: Reinventing Public Policy and Leadership Transformation" held in 4th July, 2020, 540 participants attended.

Organized 15 days virtual FDP in joint collaboration with Miranda House, University of Delhi & Dept. of Gender Studies, RDWU held from Dt. 24th August to 7th September 2020. 11 Keynote Speakers and 34 resource persons from the International and National level feminist and gender advocates; 5 number of Vice Chancellors and 12 number of Senior Professors had shared their knowledge with 200 faculty members from all over India.






Around 60 students from Dept. of Home Science, RDWU and various other colleges participated in the workshop daily. During these 12 days workshop, 13 different articles were taught to the participants.

2. Lippan Art, Mouldit Mask Jewellery, Tribal mask, Decorative Vase by Dr. Kaushik Das (DAY 1-4)

In the first four days of the workshop Dr. Kaushik Das taught Lippan Art, Mouldit Mask Jewellery, Tribal mask, and Decorative Vase. Dr. Das with more than 10 years of experience in teaching art and craft, mainly used waste materials and fevicryl products to teach beautiful jewellery as well as home decor products. He also inspired the participants to re-use and recycle waste to create art works. Many useful ideas and tricks were given by him to students during the workshop. Students used waste glass bottle, unused plastic bottle and fevicryl products to create beautiful home decor items. They also learned the famous Lippan art work of Gujarat and different types of handmade jewellery like pendant, hair pin and ear rings using fevicryl mouldit. Dept. of Home Science will always be obliged to Dr. Kaushik Das for his art skill, dedication and commitment during the workshop. Student participants were highly pleased with his proficient art works and teaching ability.



3. Kerala mural, Tholu bommalata, Saura painting, Patachitra painting by Rojalee Panda (DAY 5-8)

From Day- 5 to Day-8 Students learned four types of Folk art. Kerala mural, Tholu bommalata, Saura painting, Patachitra painting, was taught by Rojalee Panda who is an expert Folk artist. She explained in detail about the different folk arts, historical background of these arts, various motifs and unique style of each art work. Students were really excited to have learned the famous folk arts of different states like Kerala (Kerala mural), Andhra Pradesh (Tholu bommalata) and Odisha (Saura & Patachitra painting).

Students cleared all their queries during the workshop and made their folk art work using fevicryl acrylic and fabric colours on base materials like canvas, paper, cloth and bottle. They were quite happy to have learned these art forms from expert artist Rojalee Panda.



4. Landscape painting, Kantha stitch, Neon Mandala, lace work and Tie & dye by Tamasa Das Senapati (DAY 9-12)









From Day 9 onwards Landscape painting, Kantha stitch, Neon Mandala, lace work and Tie & dye were taught by Tamasa Das Senapati a trained passionate artist with long track record of creating different types of artwork. She explained in detail each and every steps to create a beautiful landscape painting. She highlighted the intricate design of famous kantha stitch from West Bengal and gave new ideas of doing this art work using 3D outliners. She introduced the use of neon colours and taught easy mandala design to participants. Students were quite satisfied to have learned lace work on Denim and Tie & Dye from expert artist Tamasa Das Senapati.

All three FCP's explained the historical background of the folk arts taught, the materials required, utility of the articles as well as numerous tricks and techniques. Lot of ideas and information was given to students regarding colours, mixing of colours, and preparation of base, texture, theme as well as composition. All queries of the students were cleared, doubts were addressed, and suggestion was given by FCP's during the class as well as after the session. Dept. of Home Science, appreciate their immense support and help in making this workshop a grand success. All participants were found to be attentive, interactive and showed eagerness to learn the art works. They showed their half done art works during the class and seeked advice from trainers to improve and fine tune their artistic skill. Students also submitted their completed art

works which showed their hidden talents.





Role of Women

Women are not a homogenous category. Different women have different context, needs, aspirations, situations and allegiance. Women from urban areas have a totally different issues and concerns from their rural counterparts. Tribal women have sets of issues which are different from that of dalit women or so-called high caste women. Thus, the required resources are different for different sets of women. The second most important point to remember is how much time women, especially the home makers have in their hands for playing productive role which can take them towards self-sustainability.

Community Guidance for Women

Formation and strengthening of Self-Help Groups, both in urban and rural set up aims at empowering women economically and making them self-sufficient. In Odisha Context, both department of Mission Shakti and Odisha Livelihood Mission are there to provide guidance as well as providing all kinds support and resources from capacity building, to providing financial resources to mentoring and providing hand holding support.

- Home management domestic workers union
