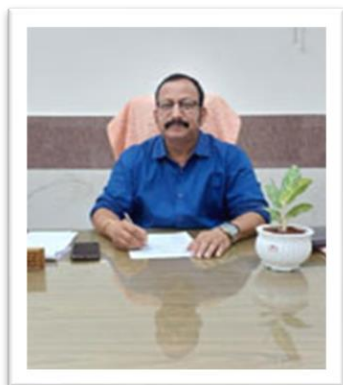

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN PG COUNCIL



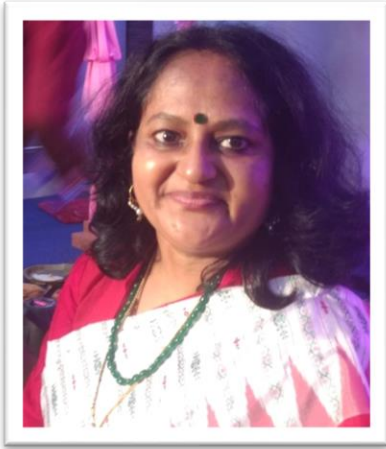

MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR, SPORTS COUNCIL



Participation of sportswomen from Rama Devi Women's University will add to a greater number of women achieving success in sports. However, the fight for equal gender representation in the sports will continue. Gender bias against the abilities and potential of female athletes is often strong as the majority of sportspersons are still male. The sportswomen must march ahead with good performances, proving all their critics wrong. However, gender stereotype makes women and their families reject the social prescription of accepting things as they are, and many of them continue to fight in the face of gender discrimination to achieve success. Some of the most inspirational women athletes in India today, are more than up to the challenge and make the country prouder. **Mary Kom** is the only woman boxer in the world to have won a medal in all six world championships. A five-time World Amateur Boxing Champion said:

“I do not only rely on my technique or strength but also on my mind. If I, being a mother of two, can win a medal, so can you all. Take me as an example and don't give up. People used to say that boxing is for men and not for women and I thought I would show them someday. I promised myself and I proved myself.”

Sportswomen are socially more connected with a wider network and prefer to stay away from the violence against them in their homes and communities. Sportswomen's bodily exercise, routine practice, and a healthy diet help them to understand their bodies and build confidence. It is found that over time their ability to speak up, particularly during adolescence age led them to manage the traditionally “feminine” stereotypes and abandon them to continue sports practice otherwise. We have an opportunity to put these ideals into action for the realization of gender equality and women's empowerment—both in sport itself and in the wider world, through sport.

Rama Devi Women's University Sports Calendar prepared by the Sports Council committee constituted of 28 numbers of members including representatives from its 48 affiliated Colleges. In the Annual Sports Meet, a master task for the committee members was to collate the dates of the University's Annual Sports Calendar based on the calendar of the Association for Indian University (AIU), university academic and examination calendar. The Inter-College competitions have been organized to select the best sportswomen/Athletes individuals or teams to represent RDWU in both the state-level and National level Inter-University competitions. The National level selected one can also join the International level competitions.

I on behalf of the sports council extend our sincere gratitude to the honourable Vice Chancellor of Rama Devi Women's University for her continuous mentoring and support. ABOUT THE SPORTS COUNCIL

Sports Council of RamaDevi Women's University (RDWU) is one of its statute bodies. Sports Council plays a vital role in promoting a healthy and active lifestyle, fostering teamwork and leadership skills, and contributing to the overall development of the female students of the university and of its 48 affiliated colleges. The University has now coverage over 9 districts, viz, Angul, Cuttack, Dhenkanal, Jajpur, Jagatsingpur, Kendrapara, Khurdha, Nayagarh and Puri and is spread over an area of 24,973 sq. kilometres catering to the needs of higher education of girls' students of a population of more than 110 lakhs. Given this, the standard operating procedure (SOP) of the Sports Council, RamaDevi Women's University provides a general framework for governing and conducting sports/games/athletes at the university and at its 48 affiliated college levels. The university takes pride in its sportswomen spirit by representing Odisha, India on National and International platforms.

Rama Devi Women's University takes pride in its sportswomen spirit by representing Odisha, India on National and International platforms. To name a few, Karate Queen, Ms Valena Valentina, International Sprinter and Ekalavya Awardee Ms Srabani Nanda, International Sprinter Dutee Chand, (who completed her +2 from Indira Gandhi Women's College, Jajpur). Ms Phula Soren and Ms Basanti Hansda two of the visually challenged students of this university represented India in the International Cricket match organized by the International Blind Sports Federation held on 18-27 August 2023 at Birmingham, London, and they won gold medal. Chief Minister, Odisha rewarded the two gold medal winners in the international cricket match with Rupees 20 lakh each on 8th September 2023. News media and sports associations support have created a new platform that was never. RDWU recorded new history for thousands of girls pursuing higher education in India about the possibility of their participation in sports, cricket, self-defence skills and outdoor activities.

Vision

Use the sports as an important platform and representation of female sports spirit for promoting gender equality.

Mission

The five Pillars of our mission are Participation, Promotion, Performance, Professionalism and Partnership.

1. Participation: Enable female students' participation in sport and physical activity, targeting differently abled and underprivileged students of the rural communities.

2. Promotion: Promote sport as an important extracurricular activity for the female students, to aid in their holistic development. by providing them with confidence, self-esteem, and leadership qualities, and encouraging sound values and ethics.

3. Performance: Facilitate talented and motivated female youth by providing them with the necessary sports related supports to excel their sports spirits.

4. Professionalism: Organize inter-colleges and inter-university sport programs, arrange professional coaches, Physical Education Teachers, events, and facilities that ensure the participants engage in sporting activity with value and ethics.

5. Partnerships: Ensure the growth and sustainability of the Sports Council by collaborating with internal stakeholders and various external stakeholders including the government, sports federations/associations and Universities and colleges in India.

Objectives

1. To initiate, coordinate, execute and manage various kind of sports activities.
2. To promote general interest in games, athletics, and sports among the girl's students in the University and its 48 affiliated women's colleges.
3. To improve the standard of competitive sports spirit among female athletes.
4. To collaborate with the internal and external sports stakeholders, government, sports federations/associations, Universities and colleges in Odisha, India.

Sports, Games, Athletics, Gymnasium and Coaching Practices

Rama Devi Women's University sports council is nurturing and mentoring students' sports practices and participation in the following sports, games and athletic tournaments. RDWU students also practices Gymnasium and yoga on a regular basis.

- i. Annual University Athletic Meet
- ii. Annual University Sports Meet
- iii. Inter-College Sports and Games Competitions
- iv. Annual Inter-College Athletic Competitions
- v. State Level Inter-University Competitions
- vi. National Level Inter-University Competitions
- vii. Solo Competitions
- viii. Coaching Camps:

- a) University Sports Council and its affiliated colleges shall organize annual coaching camp. The budget of the camp may be fully or partially sponsored by the Sports Council on the basis of the available budget.
- b) Sports Council shall organize coaching camp jointly with Odisha Blind Cricket Association for RDWU visually challenged cricket team and self-defence training to promote their confidence.

Constitution of the Sports Council

Rama Devi Women's University has a dedicated sports council with a committee responsible for organizing and managing the sports activities of the University and affiliated colleges. The committee consists of the Director, Deputy Director, OIC, University Departments, OIC affiliated Colleges, Two faculty members, Physical Education Instructor and Assistant-cum-Data Entry operator and one Attendant.

Constitution of the Working Committee of Sports Council

- i. The working committee (WC) of the Sports Council constitute of 25-28 members.
- ii. The representative from the affiliated colleges and University of the working committee may be changed based on the number of students representation and their performances.
- iii. There shall be two technical advisory members in the working committee with expertise at a Director/Principal level in the sports, games, and athletes. At least fifty percent of the member advisor shall be female.
- iv. The number of athletes and games to be organized by the university within a year, including the venue and dates to host will be decided in the Annual Working Committee meeting of the Sports Council. The committee shall consider these five criteria. (A) Area wise evenly spread location (B) Communication to the Venue (C) Infrastructure (D) Competency of the organizing College (E) Accommodation & Food facilities.
- v. Further, the annual sports calendar shall be developed in alignment with the University academic calendar and examination schedule.
- vi. The annual sports calendar including the budgets of the WC must be approved by the Honourable Vice Chancellor of RDWU.

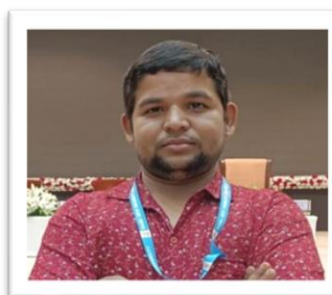

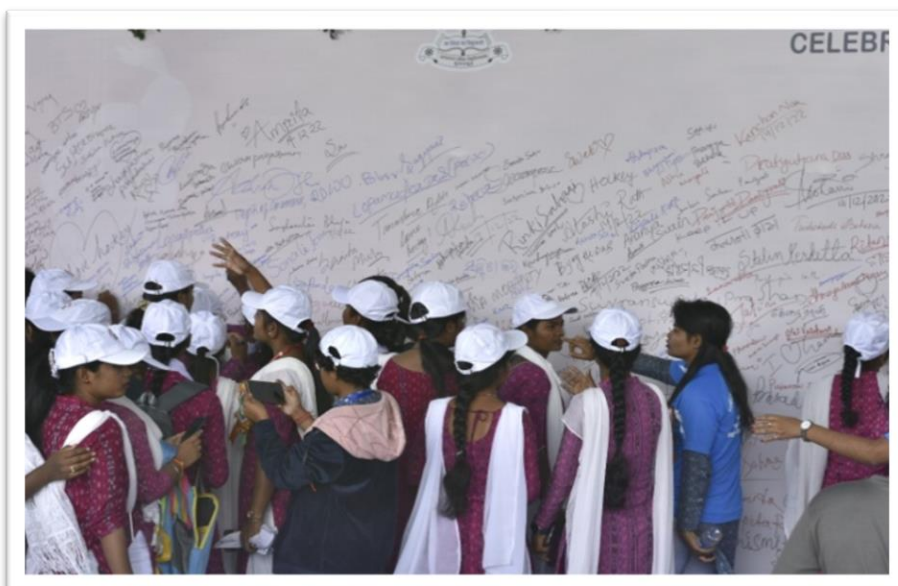


Figure 29. Signatory campaign organized on real girls plays hockey and inter-university women's hockey competitions held on 4-6 February 2022.
